

Installing New Software on a 561 from DOS

Installing new software in an 561 via its RS232 port can be done from DOS rather than the Meridian windows application. This is useful for three reasons. Firstly it is typically twice as fast, secondly it avoids problems with some laptops which have power management software and turn themselves off, and thirdly it can rescue the 561 if an error has occurred when installing new software from Windows if Manual Retry fails.

1. Close all programs which use the serial port you wish to connect to the 561, including the Meridian application
2. Open a DOS window using the 'Start' button then 'Programs'/'MS-DOS Prompt'. Preferably use the full screen (use Alt-Enter to make a DOS window full screen)
3. Change directories to the directory with the Meridian Files. If you have installed from the standard discs in the default directory, this will be \Program Files\Meridian\Meridian, e.g.

```
cd "\program files\meridian\meridian"
```

or

```
cd \progra~1\meridian\meridian
```
4. Connect the serial port to the 561. The 561 should be turned off
5. Type the following:

```
for COM1: fupload 561_xxx.mfu
```

or for COM2:

```
fupload 561_xxx.mfu /c2
```
6. Where xxx is the latest version (To check, type DIR and look for the latest, e.g. 100)
7. The computer will reply
8. Negotiating flash upload - turn product off then on to begin..
9. Turn on the 561. The display will first give an Erasing.. message, followed by a Downloading. message. If these do not appear, you may have selected the wrong serial port or not closed a program which is using it
10. You can watch the progress on the computer screen. DO NOT TYPE ANYTHING OR INTERFERE WITH WINDOWS WHILE THIS IS IN PROGRESS. It takes typically 3-4 minutes
11. When the process is complete, the product will automatically return to standby with the new software running
12. If there is an error, the computer will give instructions on what to do next
