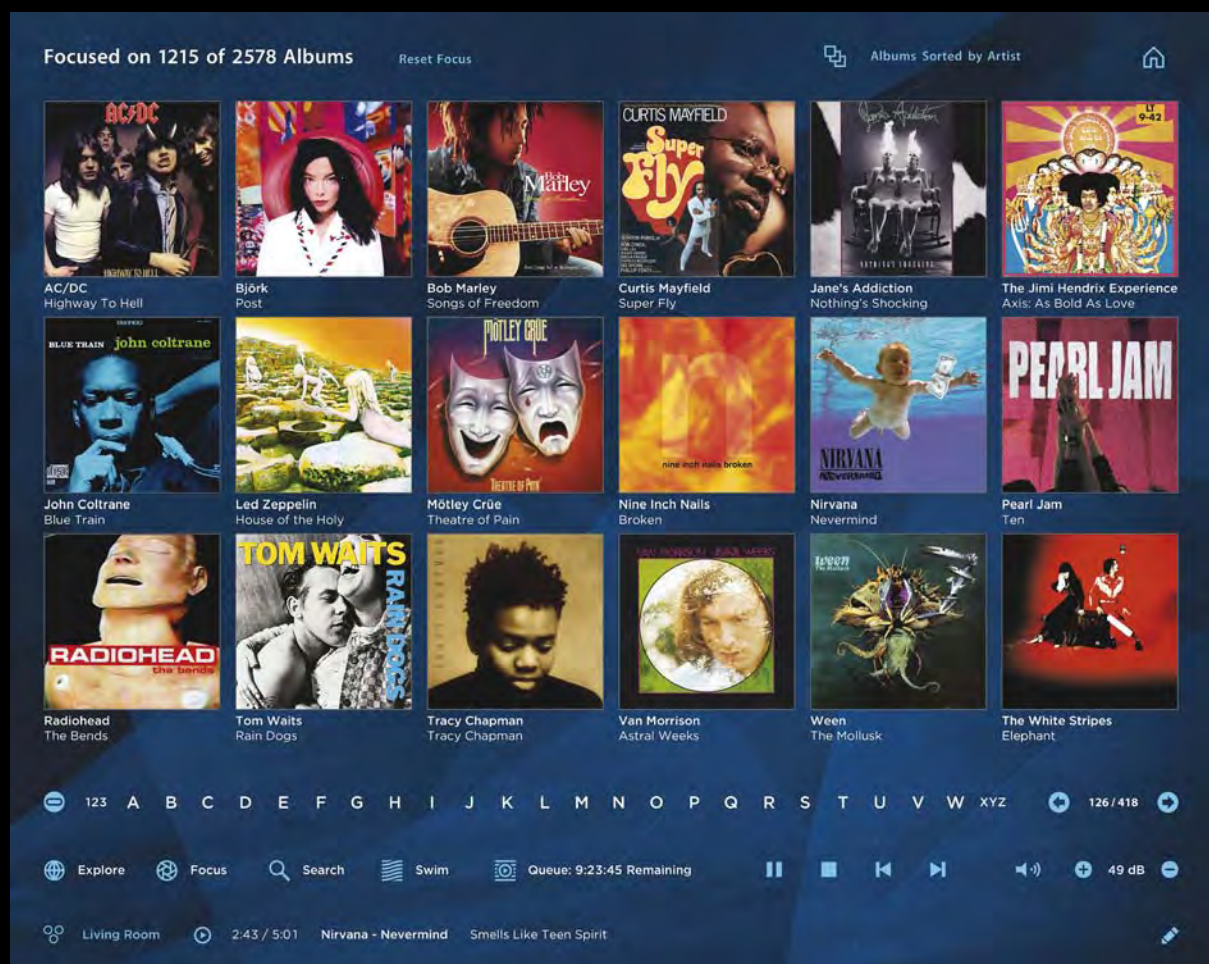

Sooloos Collections: Advanced Guide

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Introduction

This guide is intended for the serious Sooloos user and for anyone involved in preparing a complex or challenging collection.

Although the automated systems of metadata collection are state-of-the-art, nevertheless to get the maximum benefit, especially for enthusiasts, students, teachers, or for multi-user or institutional installations a degree of grooming, harmonising or structuring will always be needed.

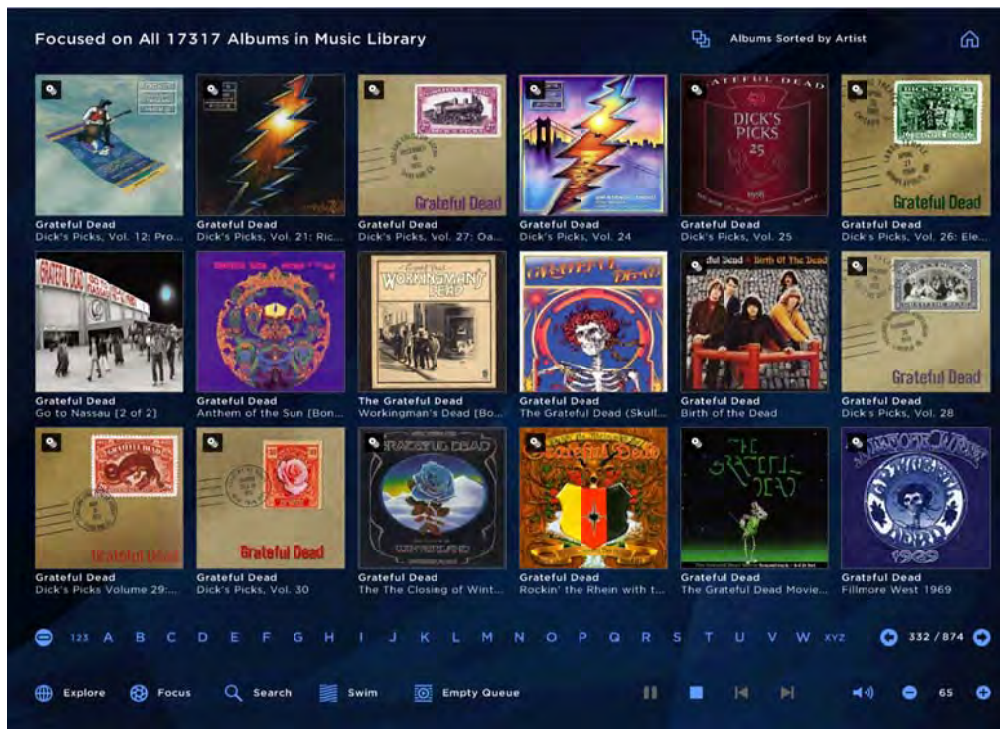
To those people we suggest that an hour spent reading this guide can inform the approach you will take to suit your needs.

Because many of the most demanding collections we support are of classical music and because that genre is one of the most difficult to navigate, the examples in this guide tend to be in that genre.

However Sooloos is also excellent when applied to advanced Jazz, World and New Age collections; the concepts, tools and techniques apply equally.

In this guide we also try to illustrate the strengths and weaknesses of the various control clients and particularly point out things to keep in mind if the goal is to navigate the collection on one of the mobile controls.

Organising and Using a Sooloos Collection



The Meridian Sooloos music management and server system is highly regarded for its intuitive and welcoming user interface.

Unlike other music servers, a Sooloos system does not slow down as more content is added and, in fact, the larger the collection the better it will be because we can form more links between the content.



On the other hand, no collection is too small and the system works beautifully with just a handful of discs.

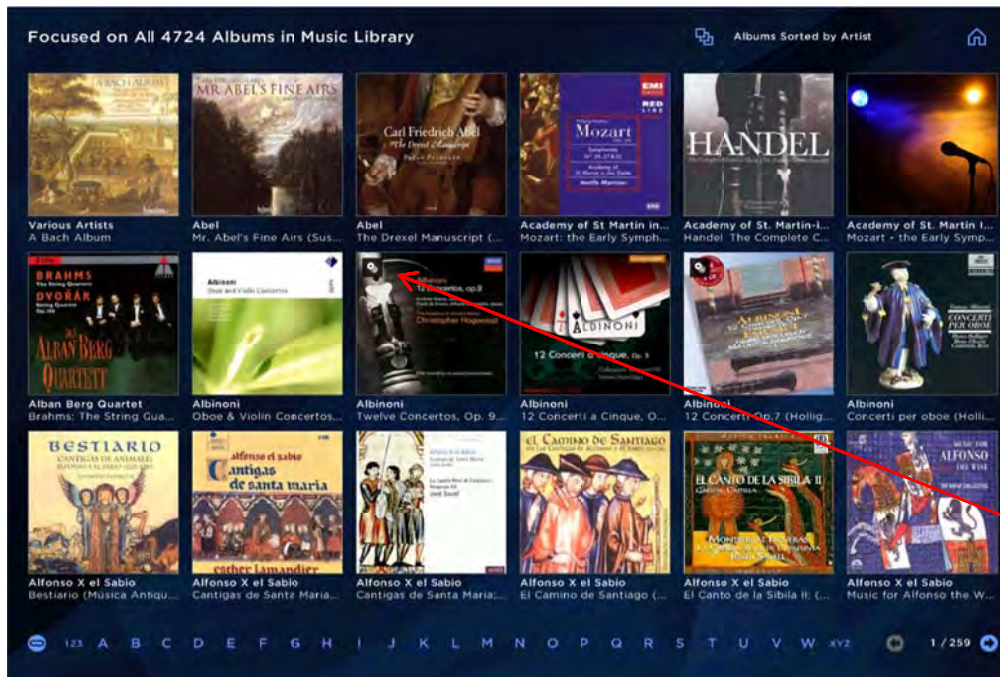
The Sooloos Metadata service will normally provide enough information to allow an average collection to be immediately useful. However some specialised or larger collections can benefit from grooming.

This page shows two larger collections.

This document illustrates some of the unique and powerful Sooloos concepts and techniques which are worth understanding before either importing or refining a collection. Classical and other specialised music collections can need some thought; users have different requirements.

Working with Sets

We can group albums into sets exactly analogous to a CD boxed-set.



The screen shows Page 1 of a Library after we have grouped two album sets (Albinoni Twelve Concertos; one by Hogwood and the other by Holliger). Album sets show a small icon in the top left corner of the key album.

If we select the Hogwood by touching the set cover then we see the screen below.



On the right there are two Tabs. 'By this Artist' and 'In this Set'. Normally it will come up as shown.

To break the set apart, press: **X Remove** for one of the albums.

Another function is:

Make Key which allows you to pick which album's cover is shown at the top level (normally [1 of n] but there may be a reason to select another).¹

Albums in sets will be listed in alphabetical order of Album Title or numeric order in a multi-disc set.

¹ A system restart is necessary before changes to album key are visible.

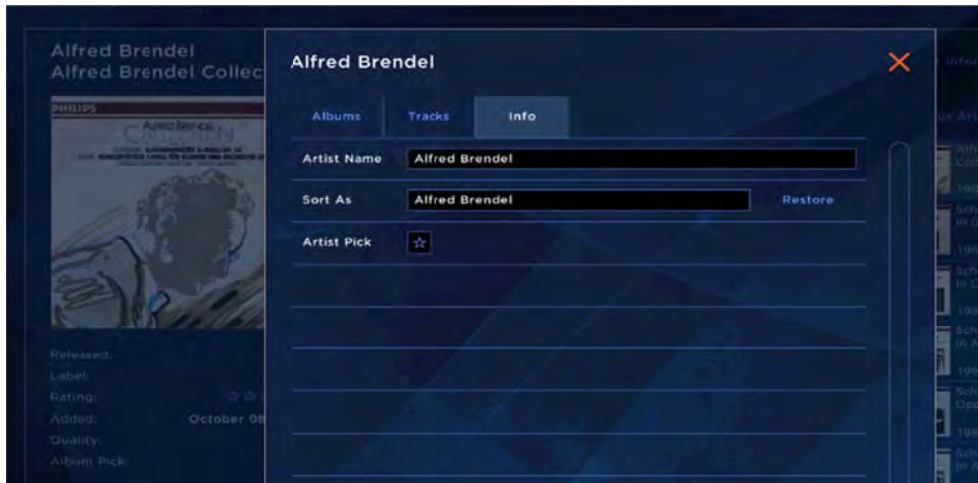

Here we show a 'Set' grouping three different versions of the Album Beatles for Sale.

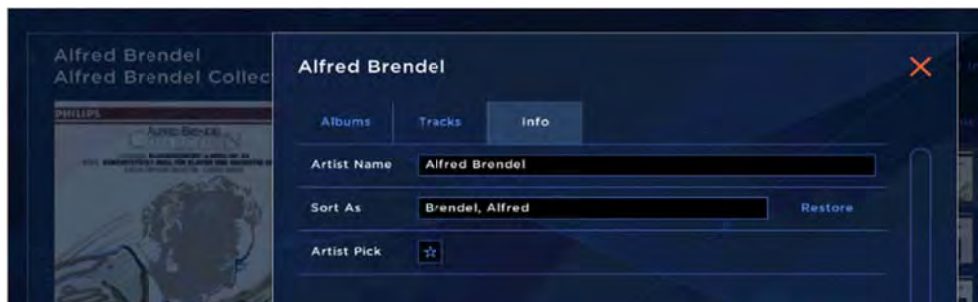
The set, which can be reviewed on the right, contains the original UK recording and the Mono and Stereo re-masters.

Organising through Naming



The Artist renaming function can be used in two ways to change the appearance of the 'sorted by artist' view in the Album Browser.²

- Changing, for example the artist name *Alfred Brendel* to *Brendel* or *Brendel, Alfred* may make the album view more intuitive to some users.
- Alternatively we can leave the **Artist Name** alone but change their **Sort As** position. Changing the sort for Brendel as shown below will cause albums by this artist to be at 'bre..' in the alphabet.



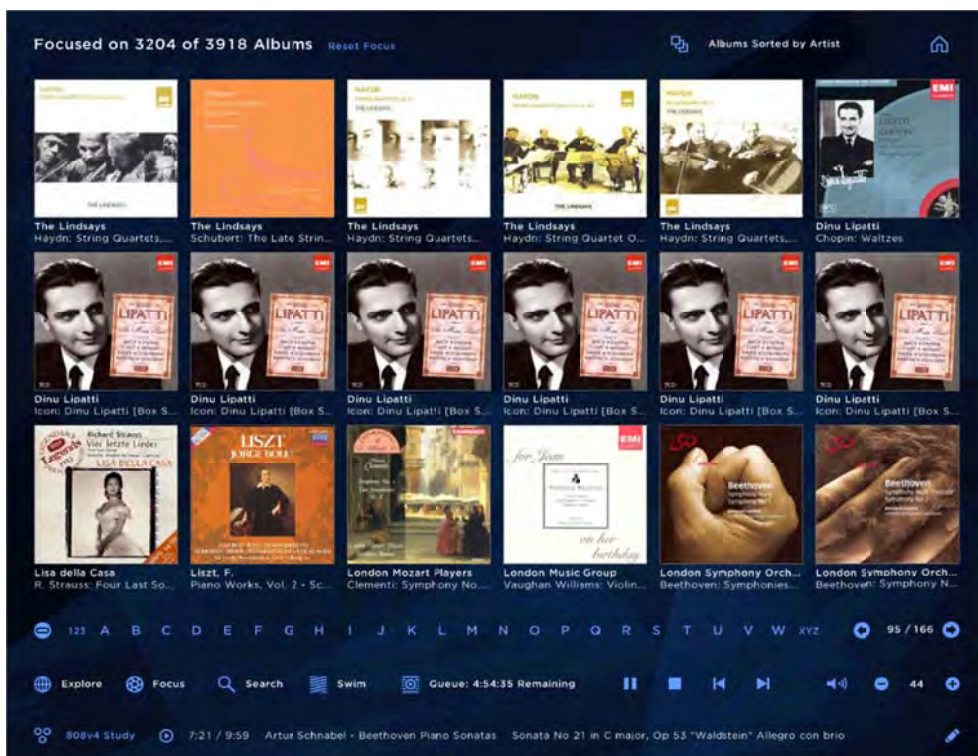
² **Informative Note:** Renaming the Artist field will not change the Artist in the Credits section.

The following series of screens illustrate possible organising options for a classical collection.



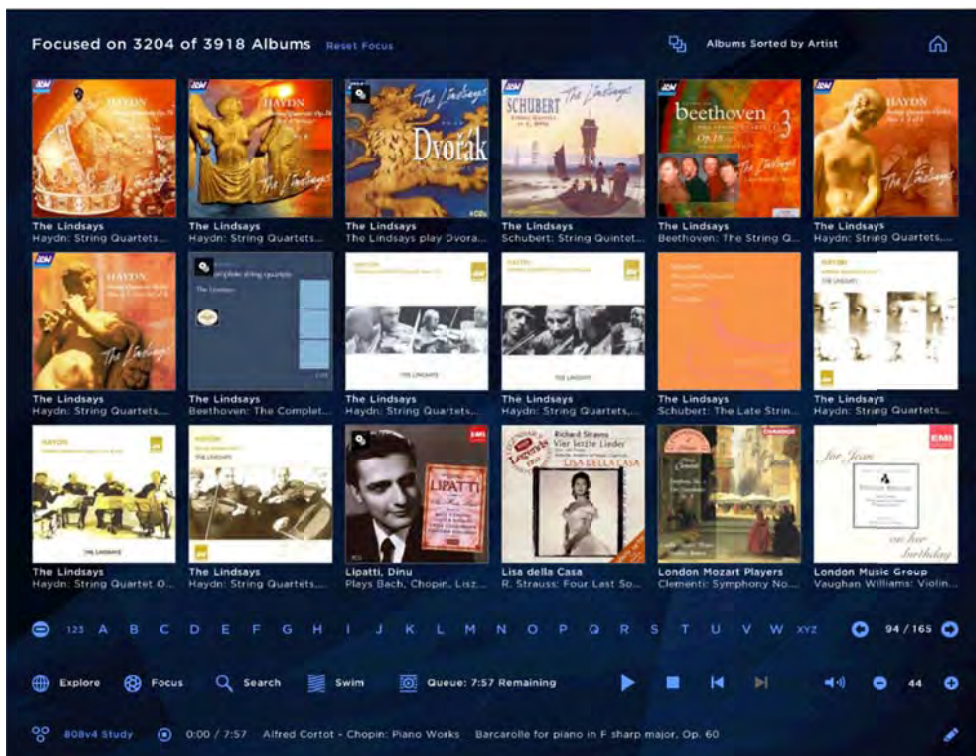
On the left we are looking at an un-groomed collection in 'Albums Sorted by Artist' view.

There are seven albums by Dinu Lipatti, one of which was issued in more than one collection. Here the albums appear in the 'Di..' region of the alphabet.



The sort order for this artist can be changed to 'Lipatti, Dinu'. This allows us to retain the displayed name 'Dinu Lipatti' but to show him at 'Li..' in the alphabet.

This order also determines the **Explore** order (see later).



Some users find it more intuitive to refer to artists by their last name. In the screen on the left, we have chosen to display and sort him as 'Lipatti, Dinu'.

Note that the collection is also one step tidier in that the seven discs have been formed into one set, reflecting the owner's collection, preference or perspective.



To explore and play contents from this Set we can use the Album View.

To play a **Work**, just touch that area of the screen.

The screen on the left shows how we can view at a glance:

- Other information (e.g. Review, Credits, Tags, Label, Date, etc.)

The example above illustrates the usefulness of the Album Detail page.

On the right we have a complete list of Albums by the same Artist. In this case the Artist means the 'Album Artist' who appears at the top of this screen.

When setting up a Library it is worth getting to know this feature before deciding exactly if/how to groom the metadata. In the above we can see that *Leonard Bernstein* is the 'Artist', in this case the collector obviously prefers 'Conductor' (or in this case possibly also 'Composer'). Doing so shows us a full list of other Albums where *Bernstein* is the conductor. However some collectors may prefer to distinguish between him conducting the *New York Philharmonic* (as here) by editing the Album Artist to, e.g., '**Bernstein / NYPO**'. If we did this then there would be more granularity in the **By This Artist** section.

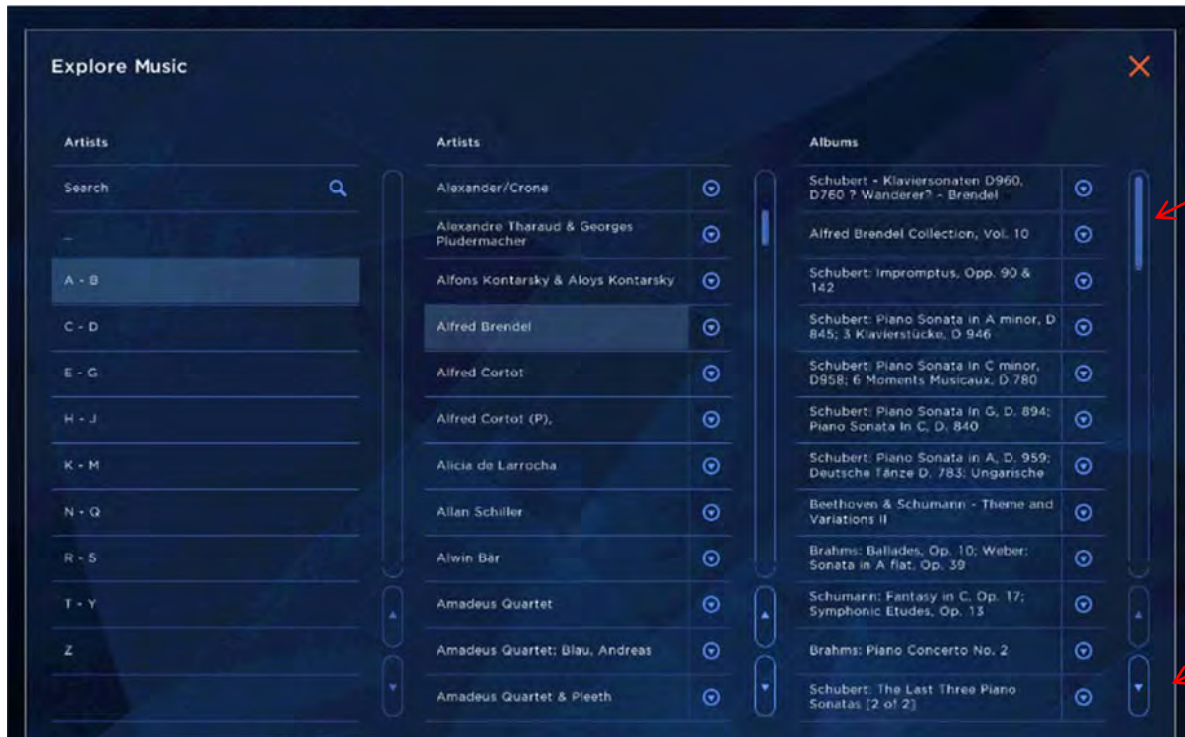
A more granular approach may also combine Soloist / Conductor / Orchestra, e.g. **Uchida / Tate / ECO**. On the other hand some might prefer to organise the concerto Genre hierarchically as Soloist, if not Conductor, else Orchestra (so in the earlier example: '*Mitsuko Uchida*' only in the Artist position).

Editing Album Artist will have no impact on the metadata in Credits where each person will be separately represented by role and vice-versa.

Finding Content

Explore

The 'Sort As' setting for Artists will also be reflected when using the Explore function on screen or in either Control:PC or the iPad or iPhone application. Below we can see the Control screen while using **Explore** to find Albums by Alfred Brendel. More albums can be seen using the scroll bars.



More examples of exploring are given in the section later on iPad.



We can use the Album Detail view to help us explore recordings by an Artist.

On the left we see a CD of the Beethoven Op.61 Violin Concerto played by Anne-Sophie Mutter.

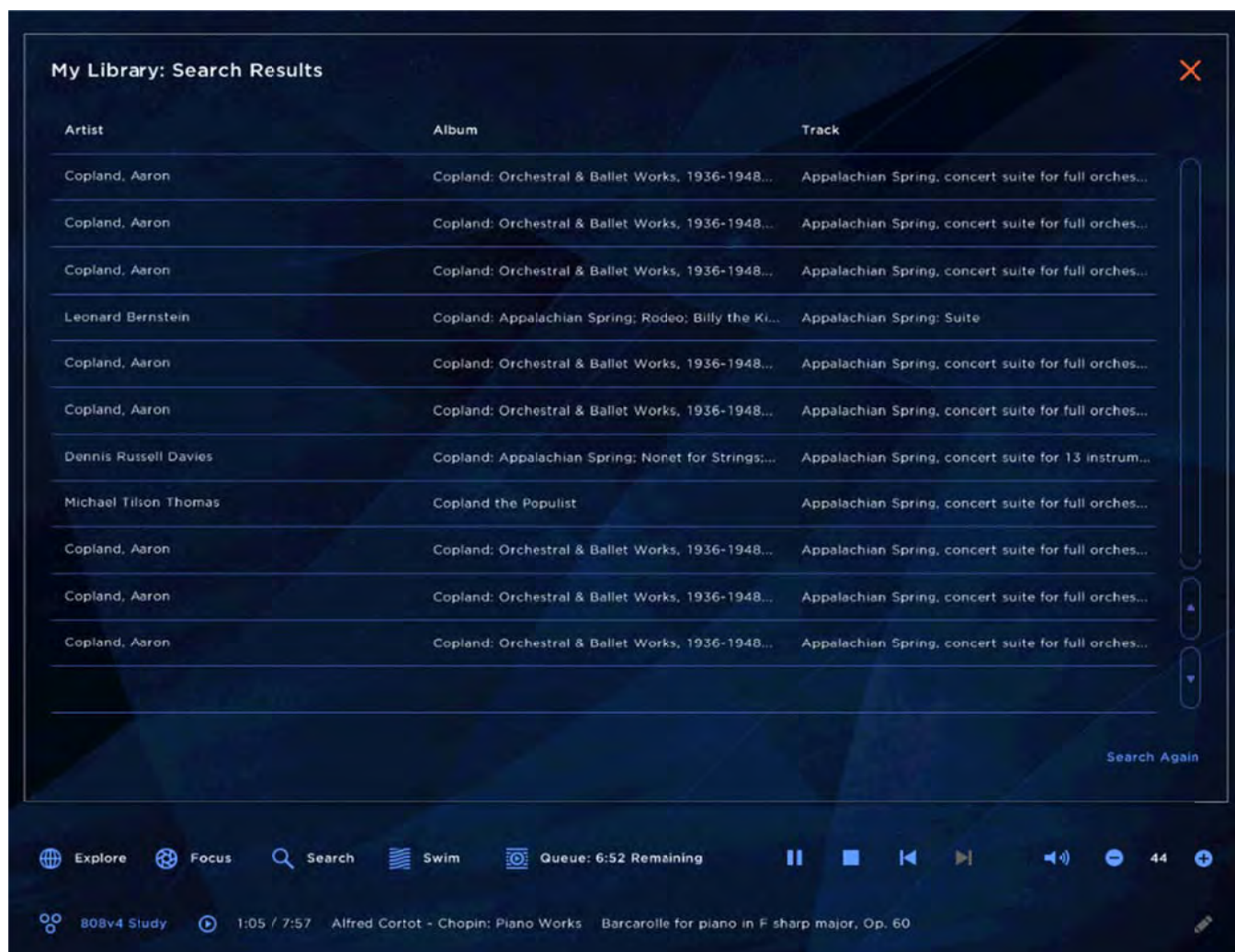
Now we see albums in the Library where she is Album Artist.

Any of these may be explored and then played.

If we had changed the Album Artist name to, e.g. 'Mutter / Karajan' then we would not so easily see her in other genres or performances.

Search

The touchscreen has a Search function which can be used to identify Album Artists, Albums or Tracks which contain the search string. The screen below shows the result of a search for “Copland”.



While below we can see the result of an Album-only search for the short string “Appal”.



If we select the second Album then we can see the Album Detail screen shown below:

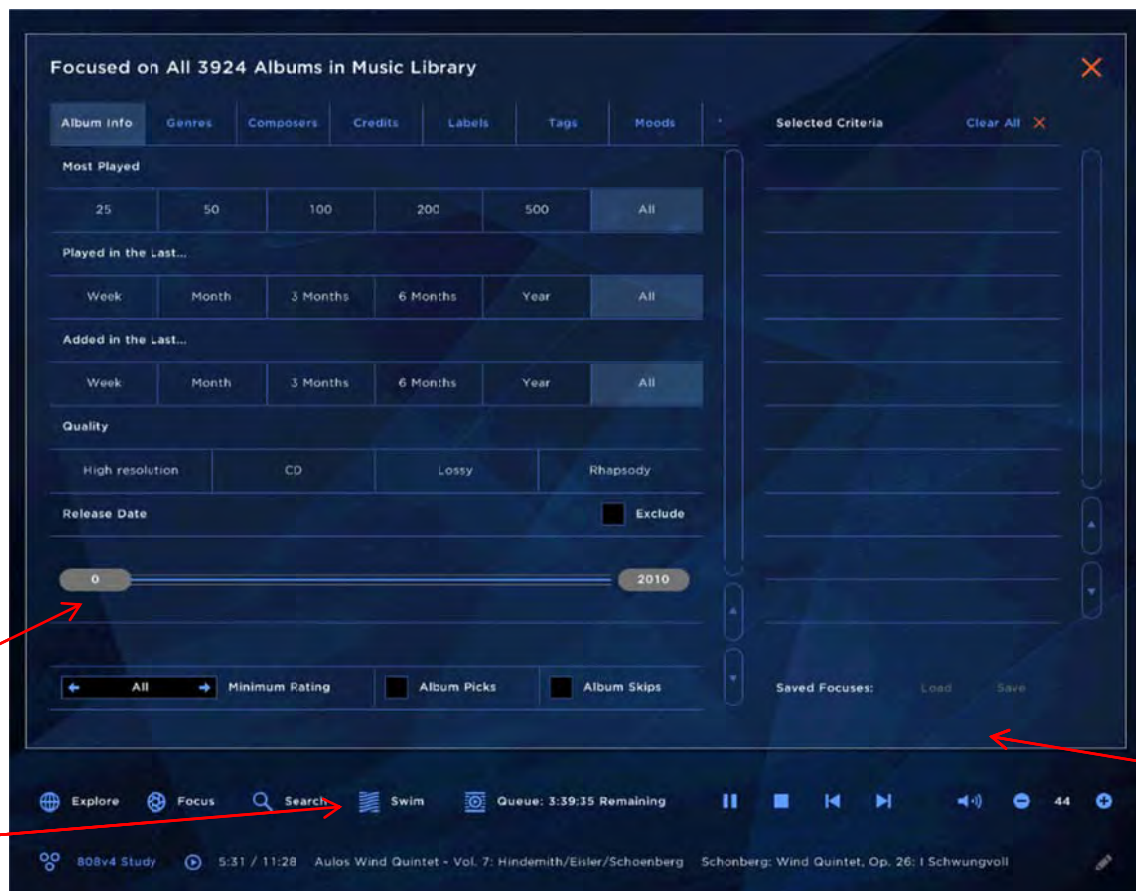

Focus

In addition to the [Explore](#) and [Search](#) functions, the collection can be viewed in a wide variety of ways using the [Focus](#) feature.



Focus allows us to restrict the number of albums shown on the screen according to a number of criteria.

A 'Focus' could be as simple as a [Date](#) range³, a single Genre or a combination made up of these, [Genres](#), [Composer](#) names, [Credits](#), [Labels](#), [Tags](#) and [Moods](#) or even audio [Quality](#). For more detail on using Focus see page 40.

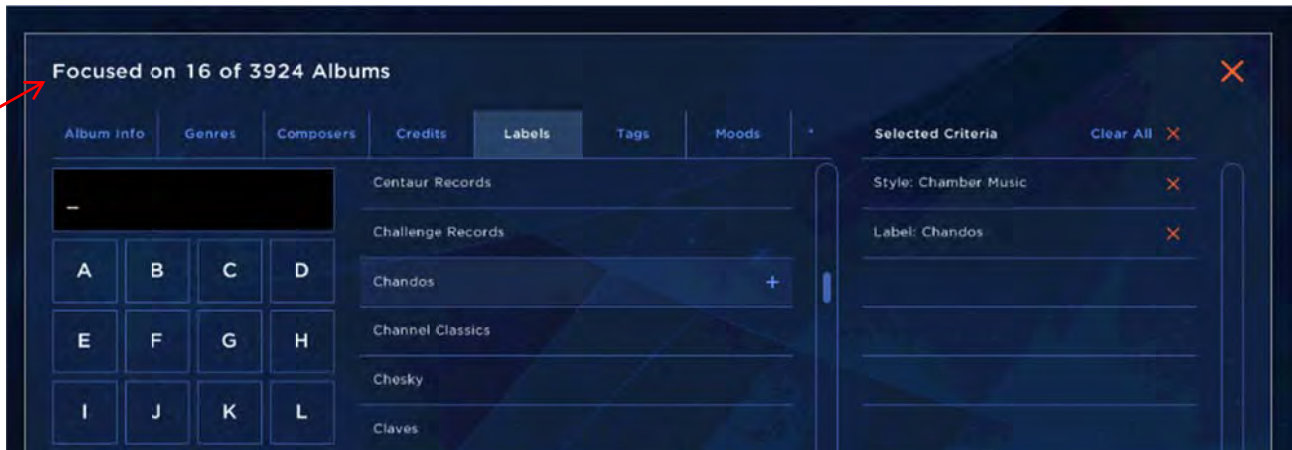
Focus is very powerful and the best results for a large or complex collection rely on the database quality.

When we Focus the number of Albums in immediate view is reduced to those matching the chosen criteria. This can be a very powerful way to zoom in on a small number of Albums.

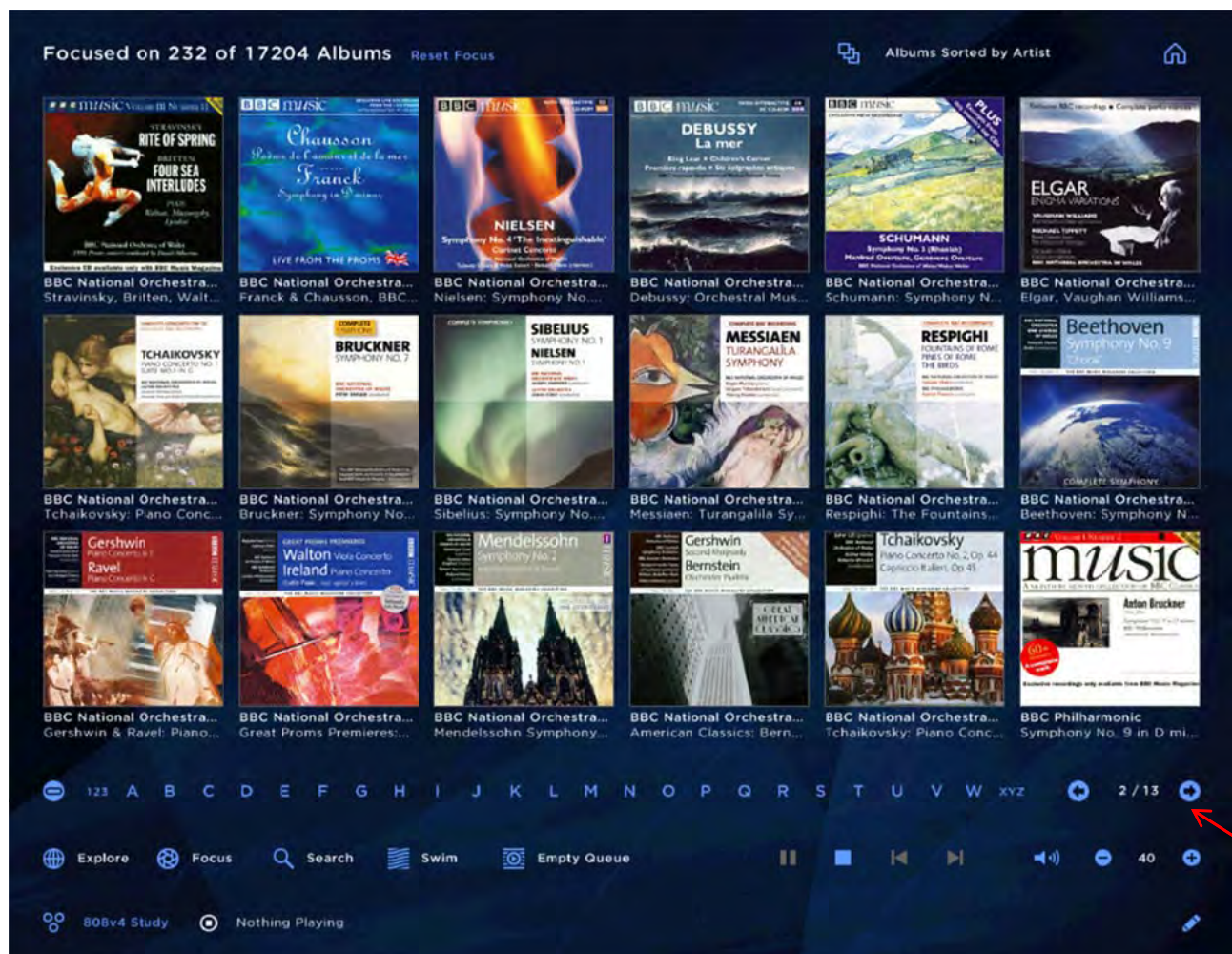
A [Focus](#) can be [Saved](#) and [Loaded](#) later, but **only on the Touchscreen Control**.

We can [Swim](#) in a [Saved Focus](#) using the Control, Control:PC/Mac, iPad and iPhone/Touch applications.

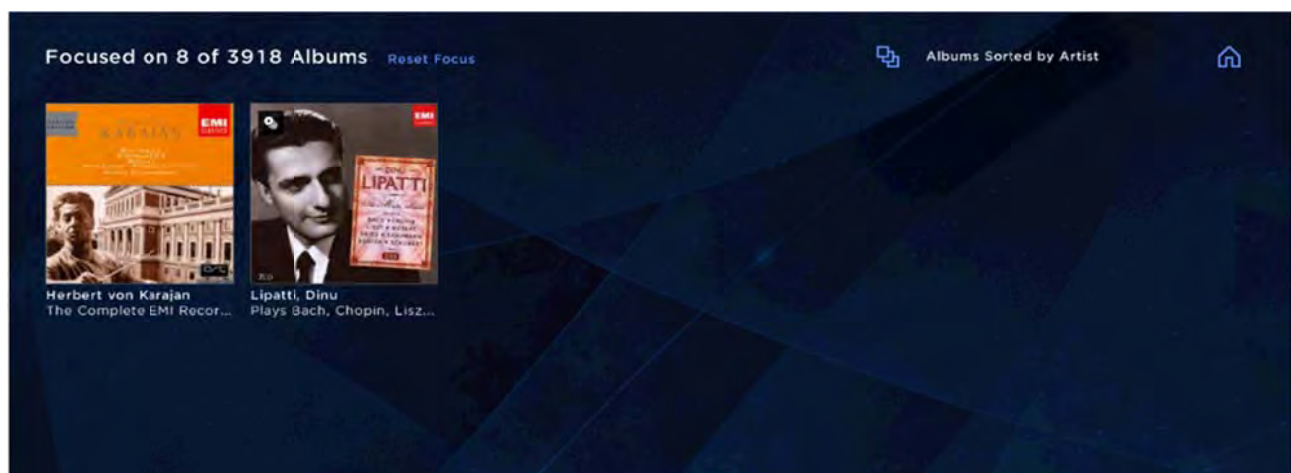
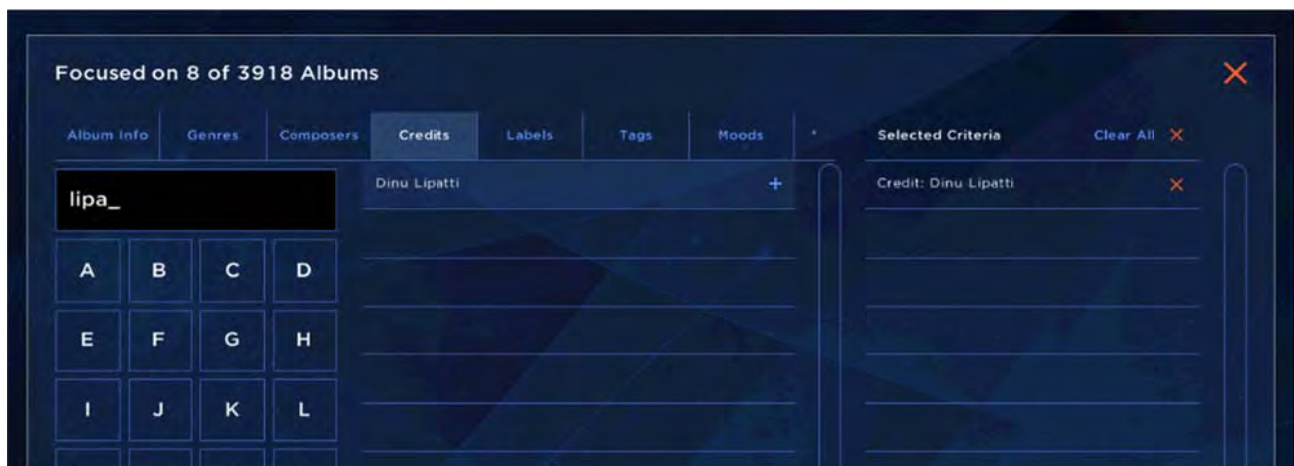
³ In the screen example above we see a problem in that the Date range is running from 0. Normally we should be surprised to see any dates earlier than 1930. A zero range-start makes it hard to use the Release Date slider. The zero has come from albums with incorrect or corrupted release date information. It is straightforward to Focus on these and correct the Album data, possibly with reference to the information sources given on page 31.



The screen above shows how a Focus on albums released by *Chandos* containing *Chamber Music* will reduce the albums displayed to 16 from 3924.



The example above shows a 'Focus' on Albums issued by BBC Music Magazine. We can see that there are 232 discs in the focus and the scroll buttons allow us to navigate around the 13 screens.



The screens above show a Focus on all the Albums in the Library by *Dinu Lipatti*. Note how we only had to type in 'lipa' to get this result. The next step in seeking a movement played by him is to touch the Set and then navigate to an Album (as shown earlier). The combination of Focus, Touch and visual cues from the album covers is rapid, intuitive and very satisfactory.

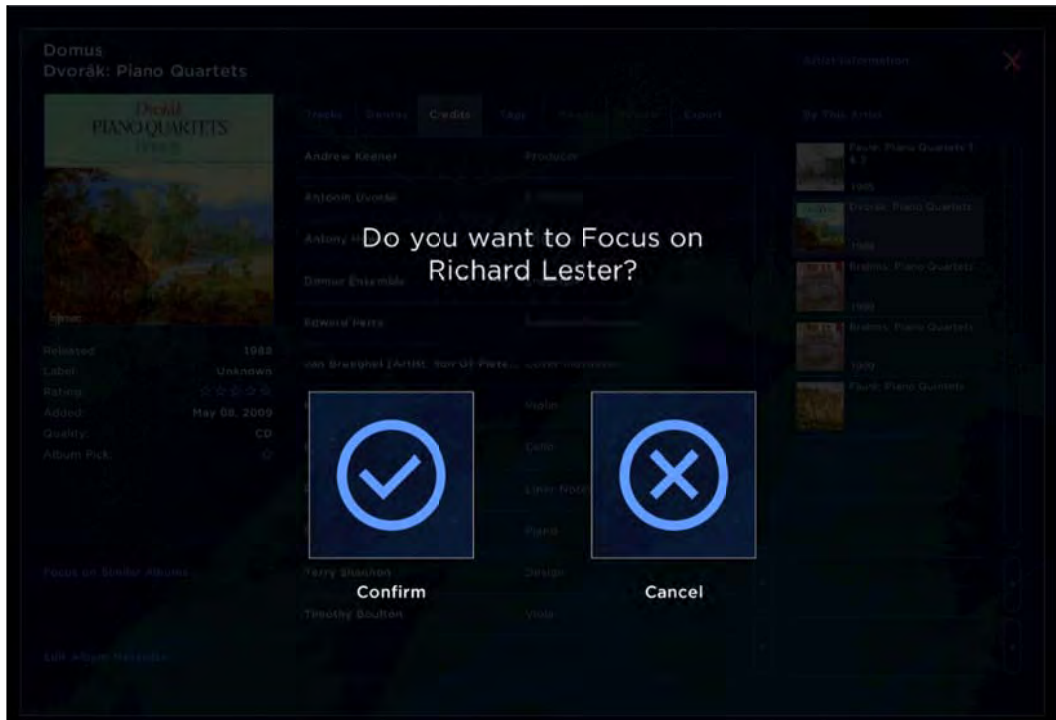

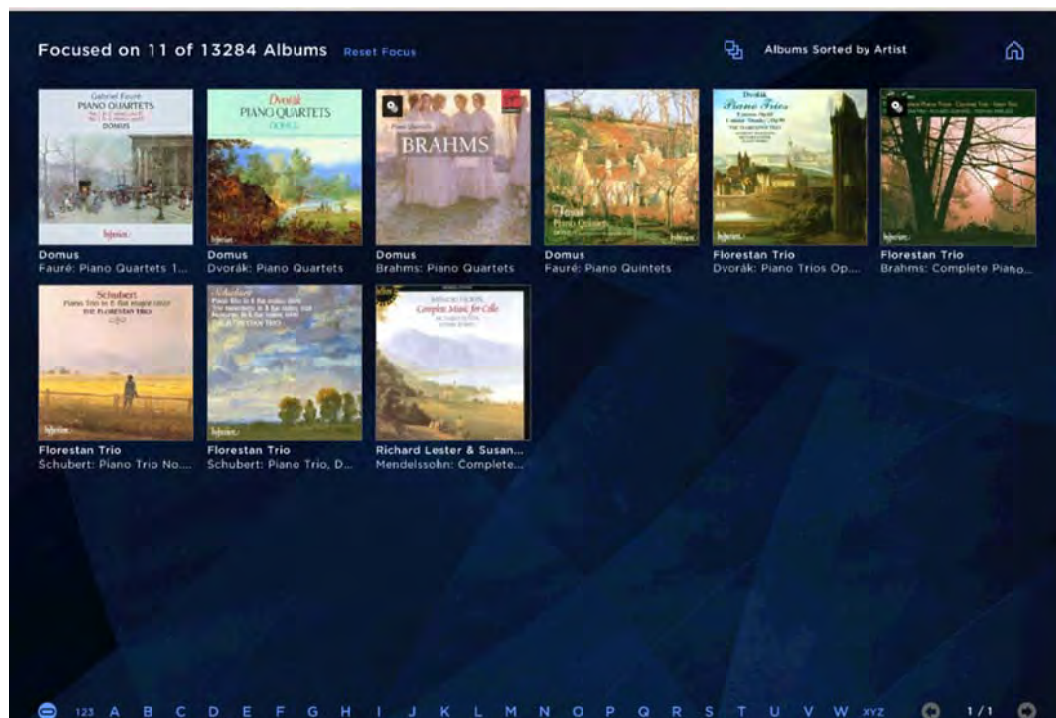

Press on his name and we get this dialog.

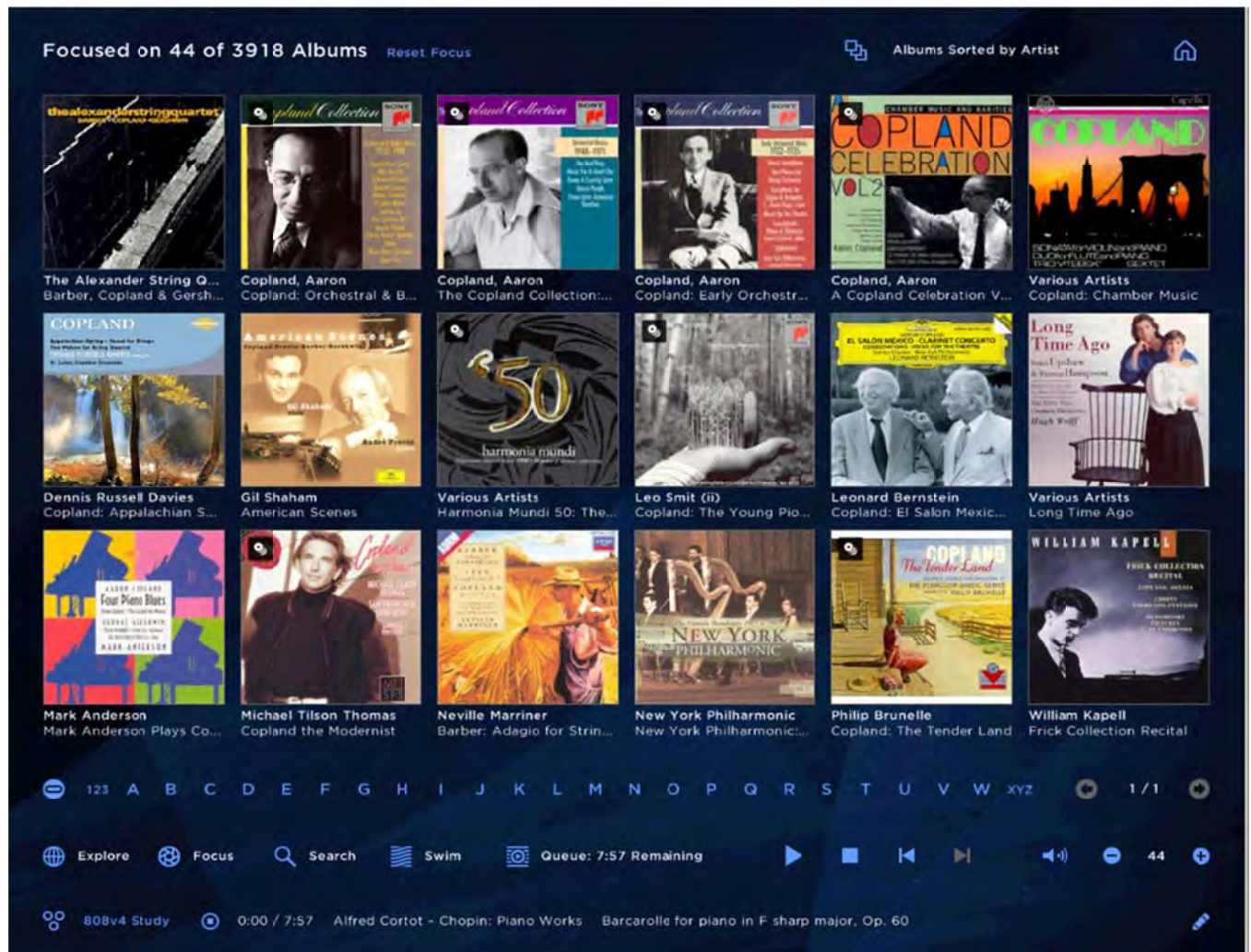


Now we see a Focus showing all the albums in the Library on which he played.

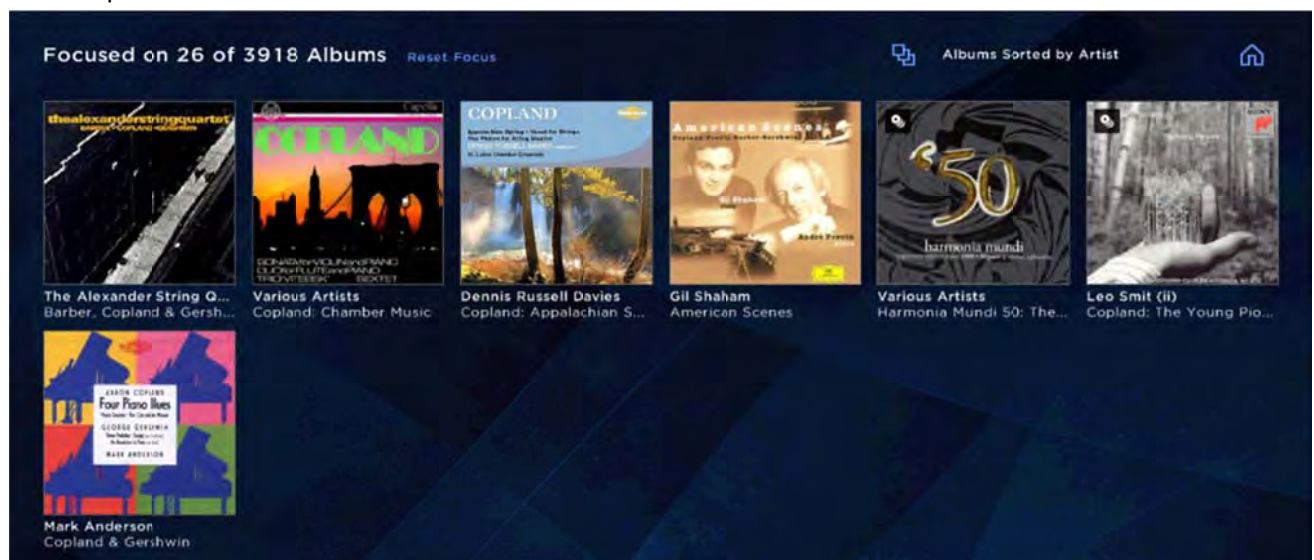
We could now go on to explore performances by the FlorestanTrio (and discover that they share the pianist, Susan Tones).

Refining a View

In this sequence of screens we show how Focus can refine a view into a collection.



Above we have a Composer Focus on *Copland* and we see 44 albums from the collection contain his works. Below is a tighter focus on *Chamber Music* composed by *Copland*. Picking the last album allows us, e.g. to select a piano sonata.

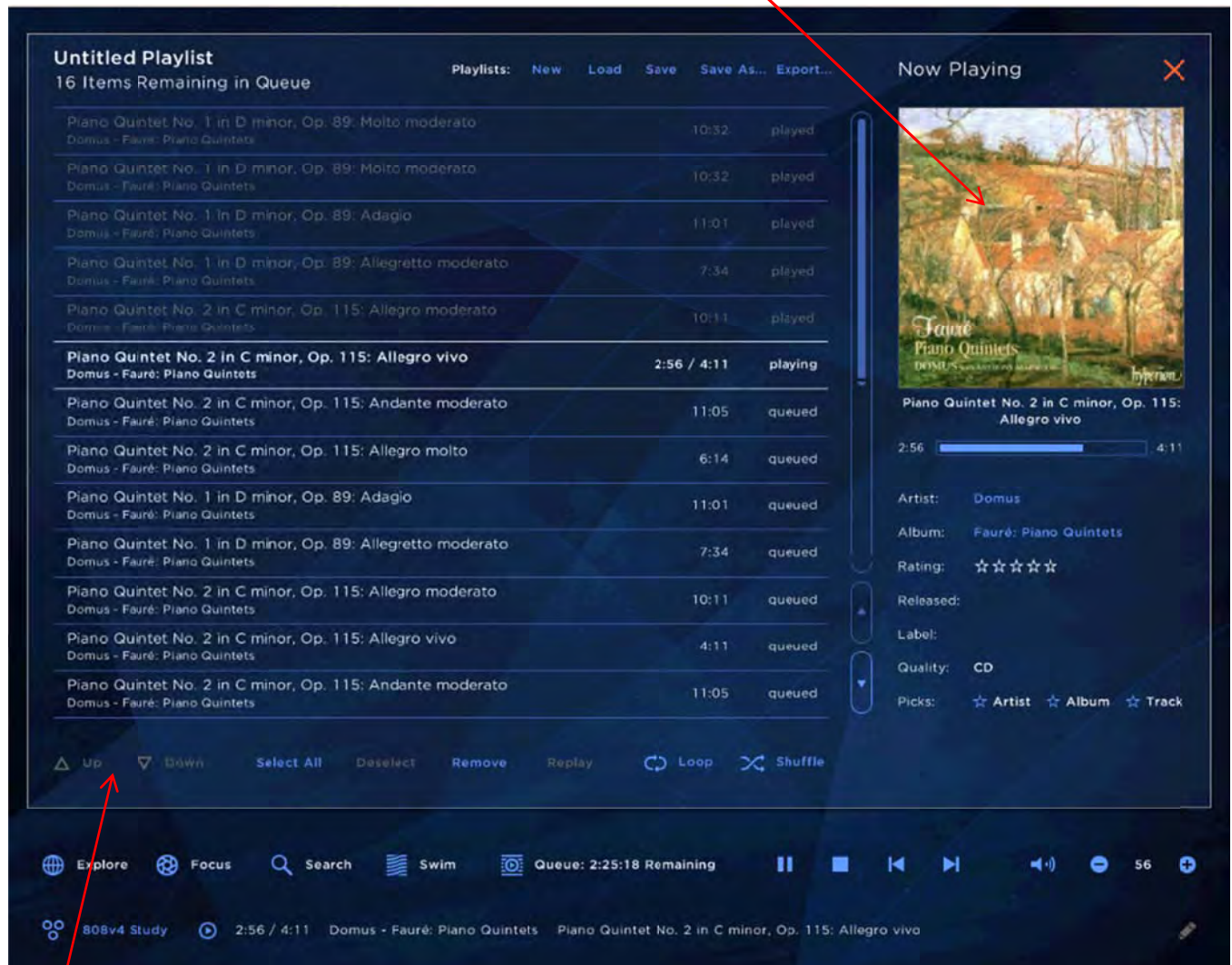

We can also Focus on similar Albums; in this case the Focus will widen to all Albums of the same Genre.

Playlists

We have shown how the Sooloos system can explore, search and focus on content. When it comes to playing, the system has a **Play Queue** which can be seen at any time by pressing the currently-playing item at the very bottom of the main screen. The Queue and Now Playing areas are shown below.

Touching the cover image will take you to the Album Detail view.



The order to be played can be changed on the fly by selecting an item and using the Up/Down arrows.

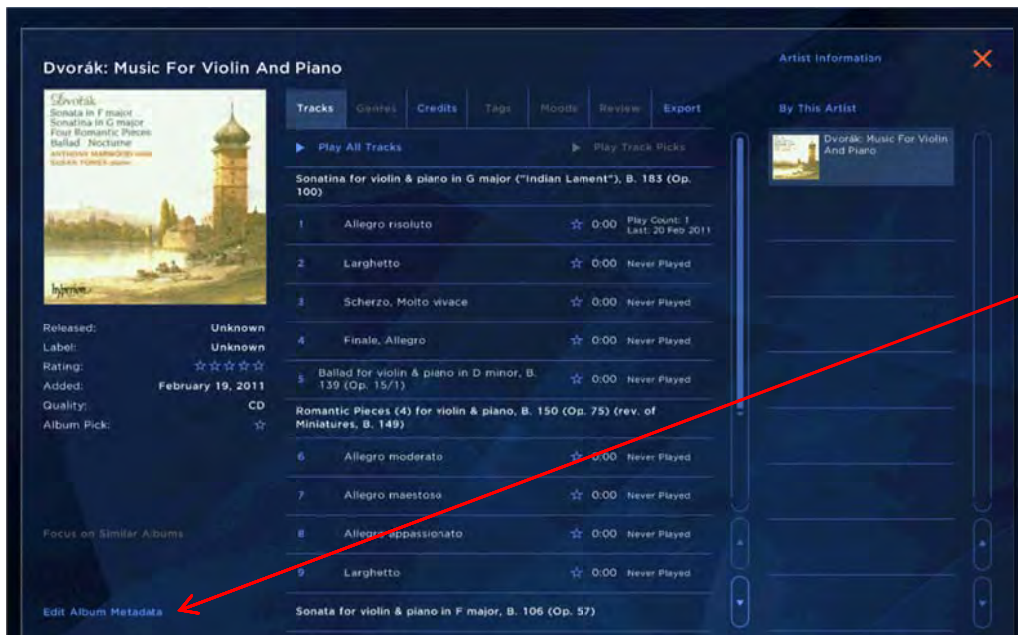
At the top of the screen are buttons to create (New), Load, Save or Export Playlists. Playlists which are built in the Queue and then saved can be loaded later on the Control and also on the iPad and iPhone clients.

The playlist functions are very powerful and allow, e.g., a playlist to be loaded, modified and re-saved.

Editing Album Metadata

The system stores metadata for each album which is normally downloaded from the Sooloos Metadata Service and contains a variety of information, including track titles, artist credits, genres, record label, review, rating, and so forth. You can modify that data or enter your own using either the Touch client (e.g. Control 15) or in Control:PC/MAC.

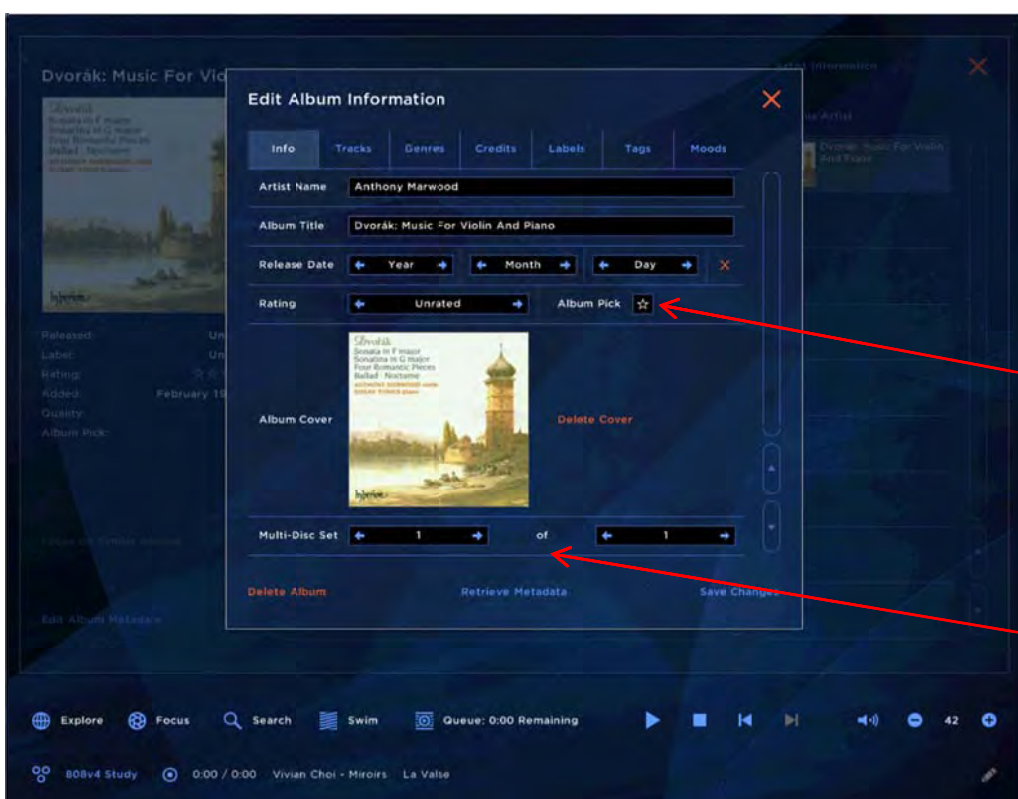
Editing on the Touch Control



To edit metadata for an album we start with the **Album Detail** page.

Press **Edit Album Metadata**

The **Edit Album Information** screen appears.



Here we can modify text strings in any of the information tab areas: **Info, Tracks, Genres, Credits, Labels, Tags and Moods**.

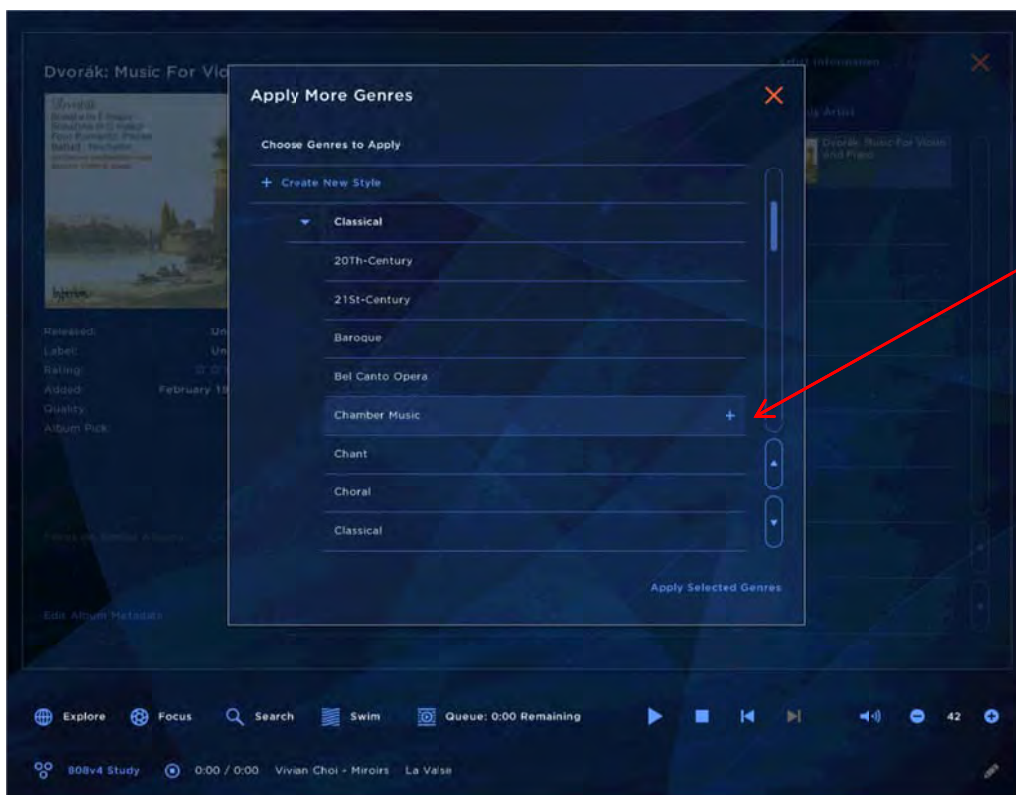
Here we can mark the album as a favourite 'Pick' or as a 'Skip'.

We can also adjust the album's number in a set (Tip: adjust the number in the set first)..



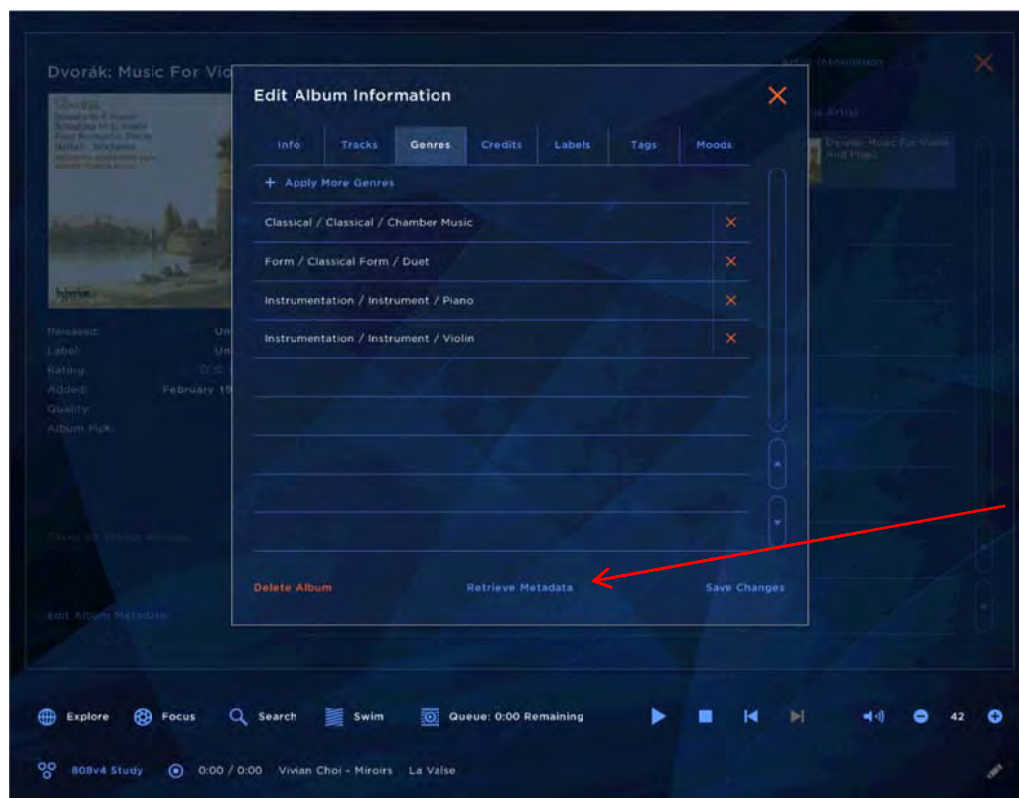
Here we can see the editing fields to add or remove Credits.

After edits we need to remember to press **Save Changes** in the bottom right.



And here we can see how to add or remove **Genres**. In this case we tap 'Chamber Music' and the **+** means it will be added when we press **Apply Selected Changes**.

Tapping Chamber Music a second time turns the select bar red and the **+** to **-** and the Genre will be removed.



Here we can review the Genres applied to this album.

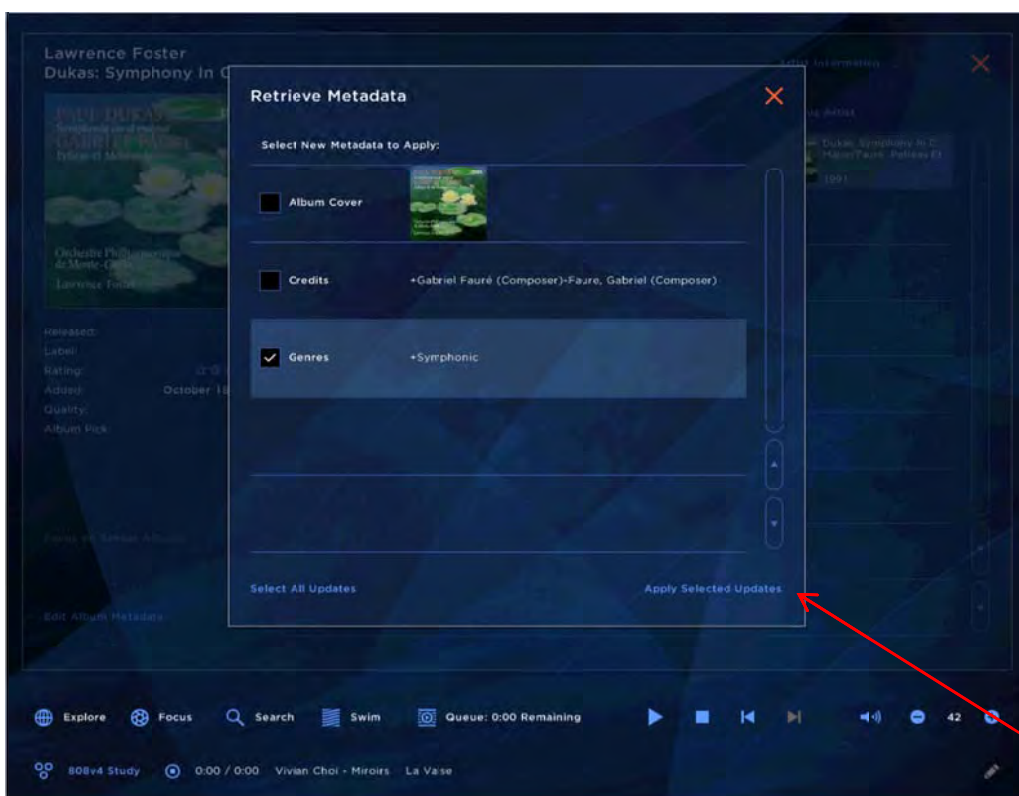
At any stage in the **Edit Album Metadata** process we can see if the online metadata service has more up-to-date information.

Press **Retrieve Metadata** and, if there is any new, we might see a screen like the one below.

The metadata service is offering a different cover, it wants to change 'Faure, Gabriel' to 'Gabriel Faure' and it wants to add the genre: 'Symphonic'

Because we had previously hand-selected our cover art and because we have, through preference decided to show composers as 'Last, First', we are only picking the offered Genre change.

Complete the update by pressing **Apply Selected Updates**.



Note: Sooloos does NOT have an 'undo' feature. If you make an error then it needs to be corrected. Should you accidentally delete an album then you must restore it from a backup or re-import it.

Editing Metadata in Control PC/MAC

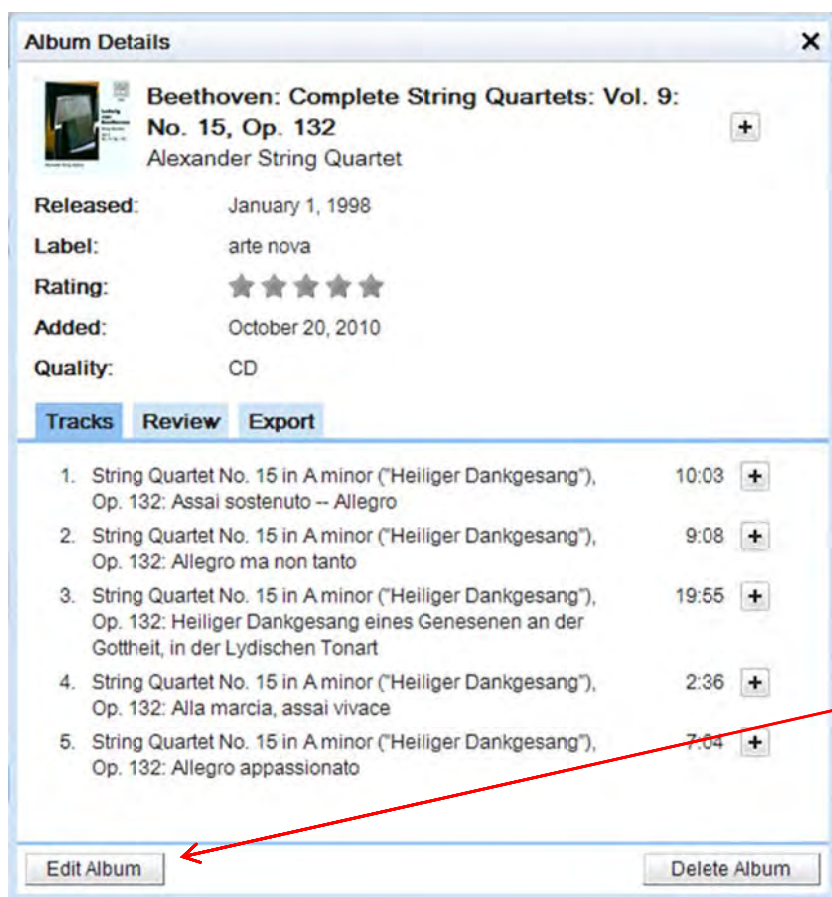
The edit-metadata function launches from the Album Details window.

To find the album Click the **Play** tab in Control:PC/MAC to enter the music manager and use either Search or Explore in the browsing pane at the bottom of the screen to locate the album you want to work on.



If you have explored to the album, click the **+** button to the right of the album name and choose **Show Album Details** in the pop-up window to bring up the Album Details window.

If you are using Search then click on an album result and choose **Show Album Details** in the pop-up window.



Here we can see basic album information including **Tracks** and a **Review**. We can also set up an **Export** of tracks from this album to a previously defined Export destination (to do this see the main **Export** tab).

To change anything, press **Edit Album** on the lower left and wait for the system to retrieve the album information.

Here we can see the **Edit Album Information** screen.

The album's metadata is organized into eight sub-pages, selected by clicking the tabs along the top.

Info: You may type new information into the available fields, but a number of items work distinctively:

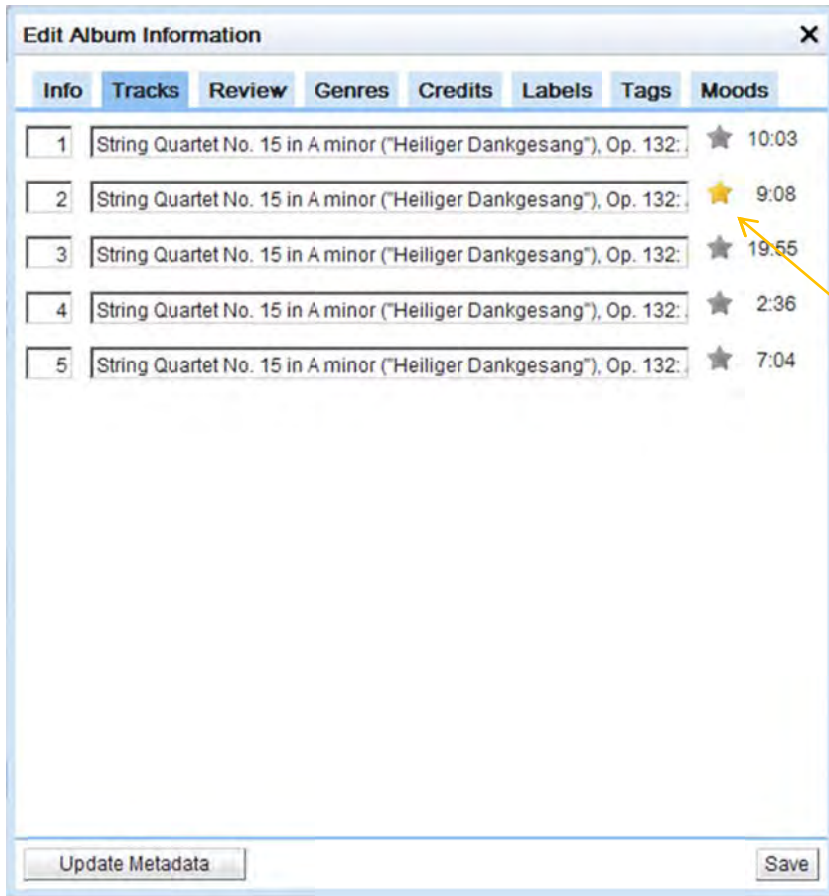
Album Pick. A gold star to the right of the album name field indicates an Album Pick — a favourite album that will be included in Focuses or Swims specifying Album Picks only. An X indicates an album that will not normally be included unless it is specifically selected. A dark star represents a middle ground — an album that is singled out neither for inclusion or rejection. You can change this rating by clicking on the star or X to toggle through the three options.

Rating. Click the + or – button at either end to adjust the album rating in half-star increments from 0 to 5.

Multi-Disc Set. Important for keeping track of the contents of the individual discs in a multi-disc set, the second disc of a three-disc set would be listed as '2 of 3', for example

Cover. You can delete the existing cover image by clicking the Clear Cover button. And you can replace it by dragging or copying an image from your hard drive or Web browser into the space.

*Important Note: All changes are provisional until you click the **Save** button at the bottom of the window. If you close the window (by tapping the X in the upper right-hand corner of the window) without clicking Save, your edits will be lost.*



Tracks: Here we can rename or renumber tracks on the album.⁴

The system will attempt to represent **Works** by discovering common text in adjacent tracks.⁵

Track Pick: To change a Track Pick rating, click on the symbol to the far right to toggle through the three options: gold star (a favourite track that will be included in a playlist when you choose Track Picks only), **X** (a track that will be excluded unless specifically chosen), or dark star (a track that will be included when no restrictions are applied).

Review: This is a freeform text field that you can edit or rewrite.

Genres, Credits, and Moods: The information in these tabs is important for the Sooloos Focus feature, which enables you to narrow the selection of music to be browsed or played according to particular characteristics.

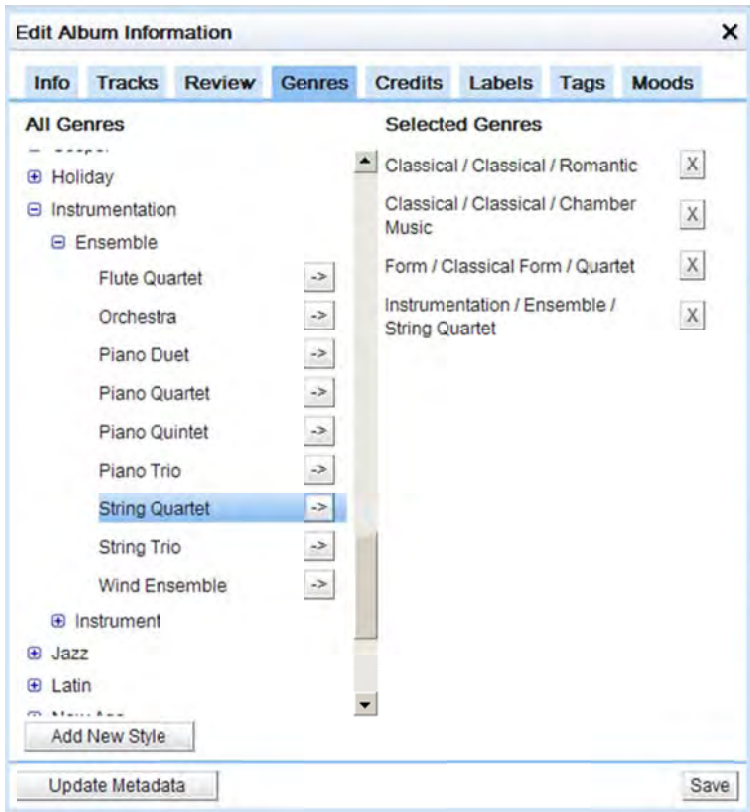
Tags: A tag is a free-form descriptor that helps you to keep track of albums. For example, you might tag an album to say that: it is fully groomed, or needs a better cover, is high-resolution, is suitable for a party, was downloaded, etc. Tags are also useful for setting up partial Backups or Exports. There is no sensible limit to the number of tags you can apply.

*All changes are provisional until you click the **Save** button at the bottom of the window to make them permanent. Tapping the **X** in the upper right corner closes the window and cancels any unsaved changes.*

⁴ The formatting of track names can be important if the content is to be controlled using a portable control or if it is exported to another media player, e.g. an iPod. For example, in the above example, the user might prefer each track name to be preceded by the composer, **Beethoven:** String

⁵ Works are represented by an algorithm which identifies common text between adjacent tracks. Very occasionally this may give unexpected or awkward results. One example of untidy behaviour may be if an album has several works by the same composer and the tracks are formatted with a leading composer name, e.g. 'Beethoven: work 1 detail: some movements', followed by: 'Beethoven: work 2 detail: some movements'. In this case the system may decide that the 'work' is 'Beethoven'. To avoid this make sure that there is at least one Classical Genre (e.g. Classical/Classical/Chamber Music) and that Beethoven is listed in the Credits.

In exceptional circumstances we may want to manually force the 'work' break point. Adding an '@' character to each track of the work will force a break at that point (the @ is not displayed).



In the Genre tab we can add or remove genres.

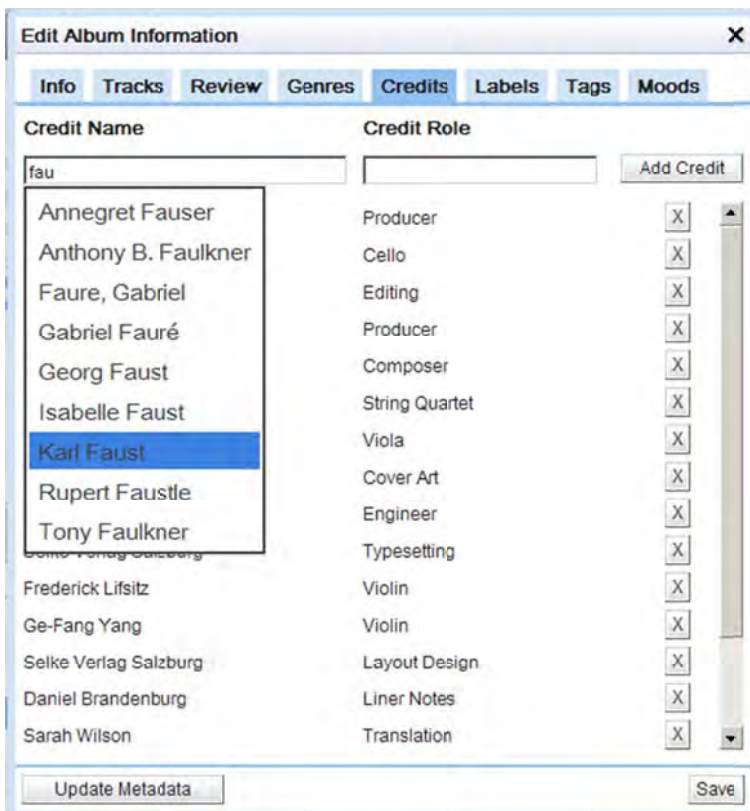
Here we can see the process of adding 'String Quartet' as an **Instrumentation** descriptor.

The better the genre descriptions, the more powerful Focus will be at finding what we want.

The system comes pre-programmed with a rich set of choices for Genre / Sub-genre / Style.

More Styles can be added to an existing Sub-genre using the **Add New Style** button.

It is not possible to add new Sub-genres.



Good Credits yield powerful Search and Focus results. Often the credits will be populated by the metadata service, but inevitably some albums will not have complete credits.

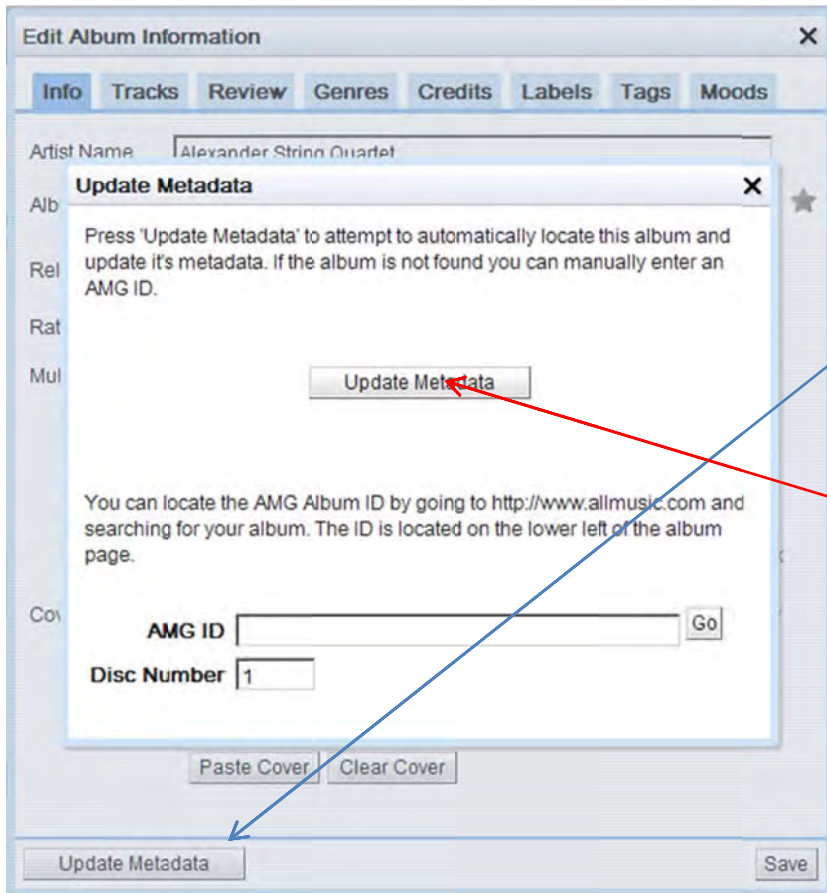
To add; type in the **Credit Name** box. As you type the system will suggest a list of names or roles already in the Library. If the name is there then select it because that way we maintain consistency and identity.⁶

Next type/ pick a **Credit Role** for the person and, finally press the **Add Credit** button.

Credits cannot be edited. You may only add or remove. To remove a credit, press the **X** to its right.

All changes are provisional until you click the **Save** button at the bottom of the window.

⁶ We offer several dummy albums for download which are pre-loaded with common credits, e.g. composers in various representations, several Genre Styles and some useful Tags. Loading one of these dummy albums at the outset can simplify editing because it pre-populates the Library with data points. The dummy albums can be deleted later.



You might suspect that the metadata service has more information on an album. Alternatively we may find that a better 'recognition hit' happens if the **Artist Name** or **Album Name** field has been corrected.

Press **Update Metadata**. We see the pop-up window on the left. Here there are two options:

- **Update Metadata** forces a new lookup.⁷
- You may think that All Music Guide (AMG) has in fact got more information than has so far been discovered. In which case it may be possible to browse to the correct album on www.allmusic.com and to copy and paste the AMG ID. Press **Go** and hope!

⁷ **Warning:** Be aware that unlike in the Touch control, there is no opportunity to review changes from the metadata service and this process has no undo.

Bulk Data Editing on the Touch Control

In recent software versions we have added some 'power tools' that can radically speed up grooming or customising a collection. These tools are essentially in two groups: 'bulk editing' and 'forensic focus'.

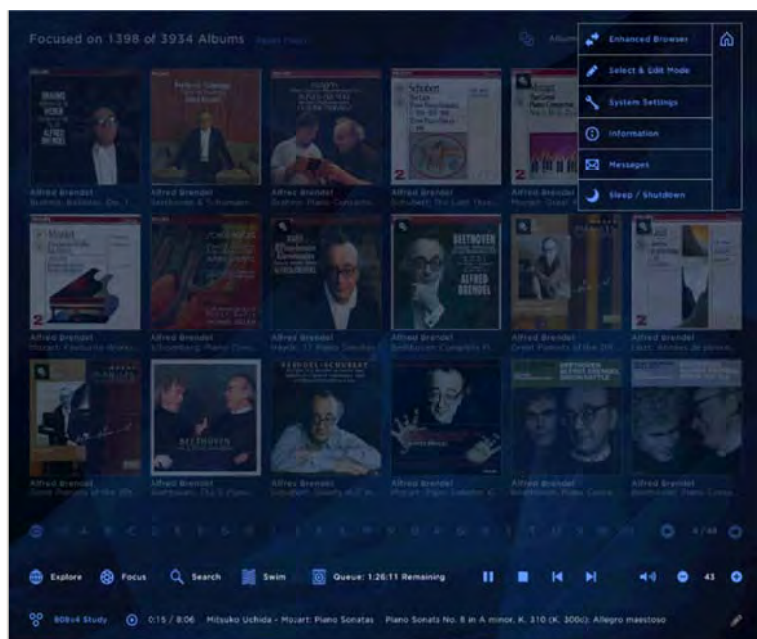
Warning: This section describes 'power tools' which, if used incorrectly can wreak havoc. There is NO UNDO. We strongly advise you to have a good backup ready, just in case!

Select and Edit Mode



The Touchscreen has two viewing modes, **Enhanced Browser** shown left.

This places **Focus** at the top of the screen and has fewer buttons)



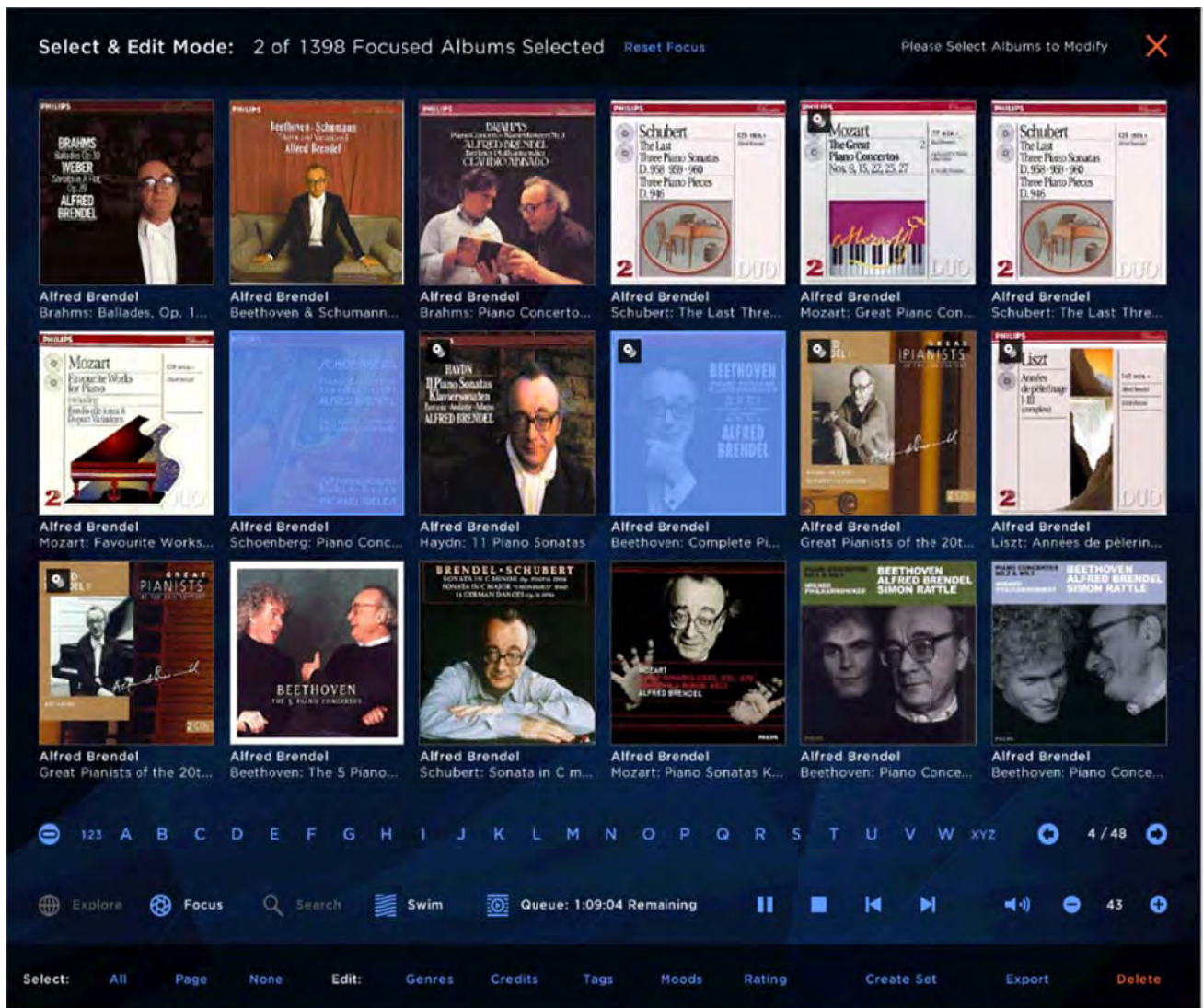
This is **Standard Browser**

Switch between the two using the top-right **Home** menu.

To be most useful we recommend that **Select and Edit** be used in **Standard Browser** mode.

To enter Select and Edit mode Press the  (pencil) symbol.

If you can't see the pencil then probably Editing is turned off in Home /System Settings /Security



Above we see **Select and Edit Mode**. Two active areas have appeared on the top and bottom of the screen but we still have access to the transport, volume and other navigation controls. At the top we have an **X** to exit this mode and we can see a summary of the number selected from the current Focus. At the bottom we have a number of new buttons:

Select: In this mode Albums can be selected by touching them (see the two examples above). If a set is selected then all the albums in that set are selected for action. We also have buttons to select **All** albums in the library; **Page** to select all the albums we can see. While selecting we can browse to other pages using the alpha navigation or forward **➡**/back keys **⬅** and select more albums. Always be aware of how many albums are selected before performing an edit. **None** de-selects all albums.

Edit: We can choose to edit **Genres**, **Credits**, **Tags**, or **Moods** for the selected albums.

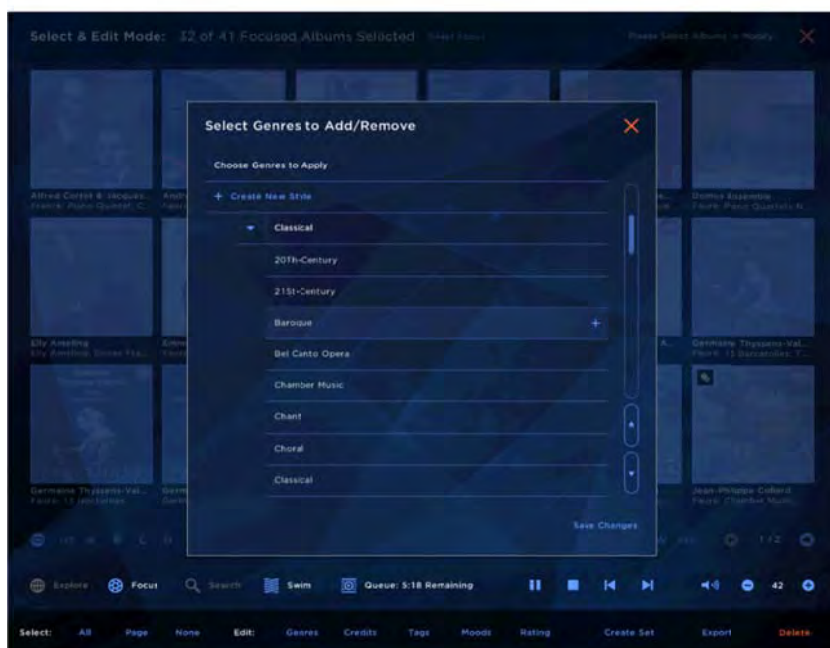
Create Set will group the selected albums into a 'set' (see page 5).

Export allows us to add the selected albums to an Export destination.

Delete The Delete key will perform (after a warning) a non-recoverable delete of all selected Albums. This is a powerful feature but you need to use it with care; stay alert!

In Select and Edit Mode we can add and/or remove **Genres**, **Credits**, **Tags**, and **Moods**.

Add/Remove Genre



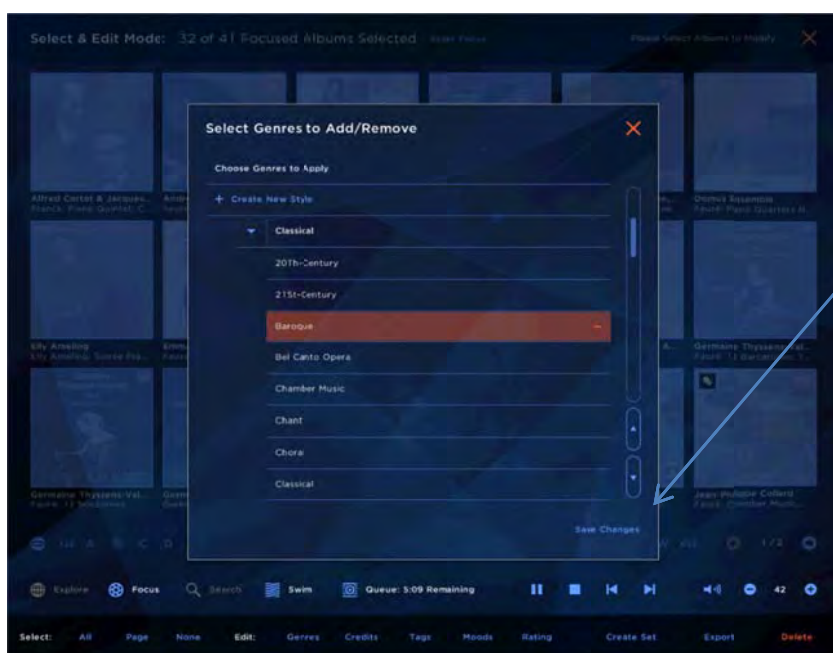
Here we show the dialog screen for Add/Remove Genres.

To add Classical/Classical/Baroque to the 32 selected albums pick it.

Pressing Baroque once shows the blue highlight and + indicating this genre will be added.

If we press it again the select bar changes to a red highlight and - (see below) and the Genre would be removed.

Pressing a third time de-selects the Genre.



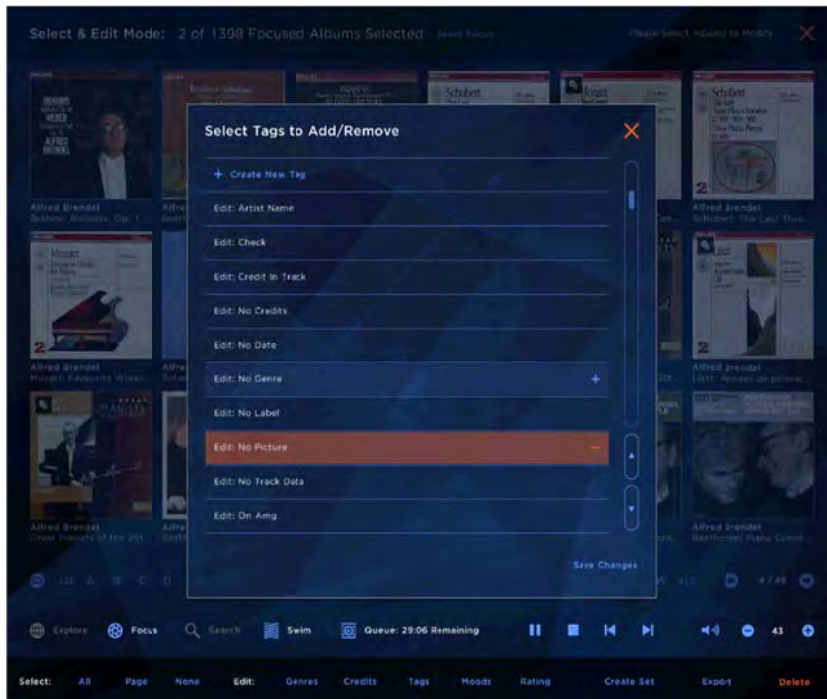
Multiple Genres can be added or removed in one operation.

Complete the edit with **Save Changes**.

Note: Sooloos has a large number of Genres built in but there is room for customisation. Please see the sections on *Finer Points of Focus* (page 40) and *The Elements of Metadata* (page 44).

Note: We might use this feature to speed up grooming of a collection. For example we might Focus on Handel as Composer and reasonably add the genre 'Baroque'.

Important Note: Add/remove is NOT search & replace! If we want to remove a field from any of the selected albums it will be done for those that contain it, however a simultaneous addition will appear on *all selected albums*. Remember also there is no 'undo' function in editing.

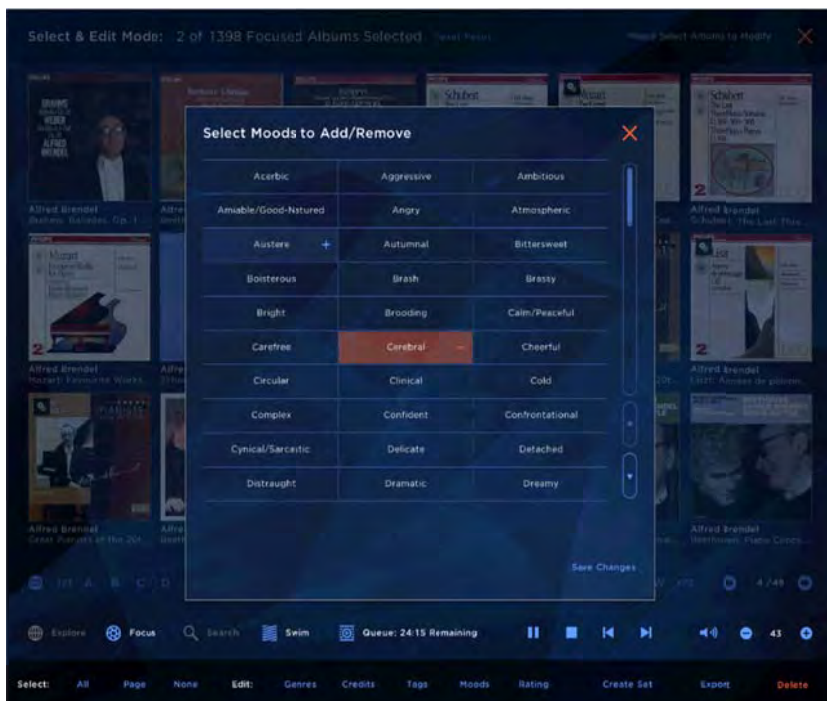


Add/Remove Tags operates in a similar way to **Genres**.

On the left we can see setting up to add the Tag 'Edit: No Genre' and to remove the Tag 'Edit: No Picture' from the selected albums.

Make the changes permanent by pressing **Save Changes**.

Be aware that if we make edits to a large number of albums it may take a few minutes for the changes to be fully effective.



Add/Remove Moods works in a similar fashion.

Here we can see adding Austere while removing Cerebral.

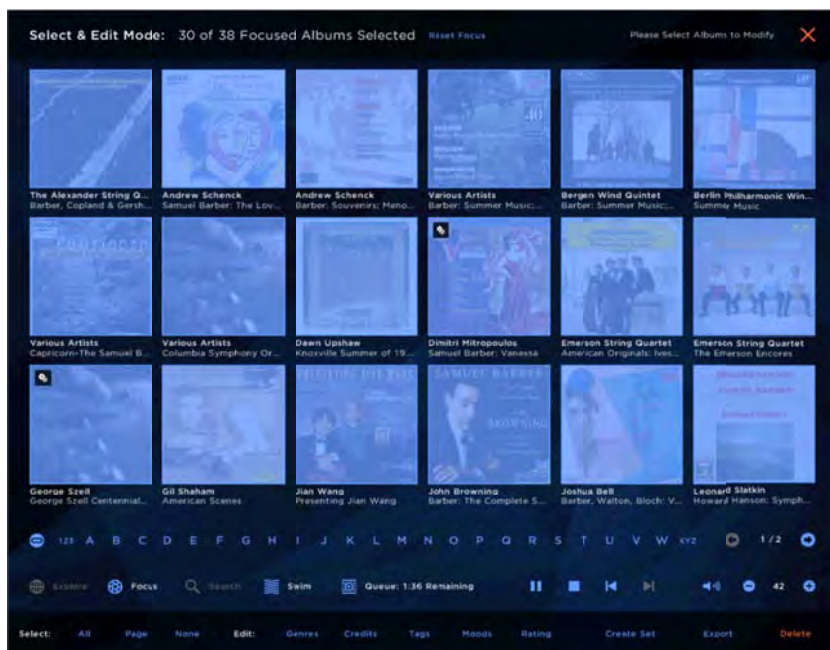
A very useful feature of Select and Edit mode is the ability to modify Credits in multiple albums.

The following screens take us through a worked example to change the Composer Credit for 'Samuel Barber' to 'Barber, Samuel'. (We might want to do this so that we find him under 'B' in the browser on the iPad).



To start we Focus the entire collection to show only those albums with the **Samuel Barber** Credit.

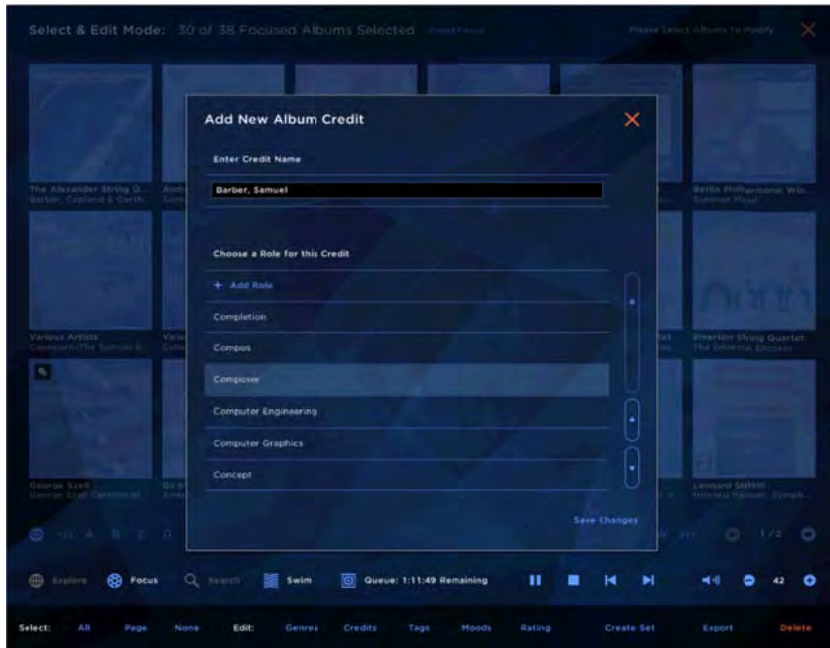
Notice we found him by just typing 'bar' and then selecting from the list.



After pressing **Select All** the Select and Edit browser window now looks like this.

Note that although Focus showed us there are 38 albums with this Credit, the window on the left only shows 30, this is because some of the albums are formed into sets.

Important Note: Add/remove is NOT search & replace. If we want to remove a Credit from any of the selected albums it will be done for those which contain it; however a simultaneous Credit *addition* will appear on *all selected albums*. Remember also there is no 'undo' function in editing.

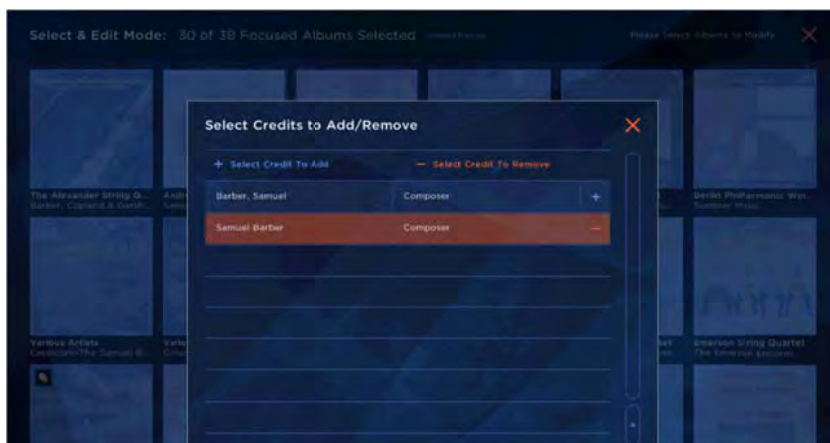


Press the bottom **Credits** button and we get a new **Select Credits to Add/Remove** dialog.

Pressing **Select Credit to Add** gives us this familiar window on the left.

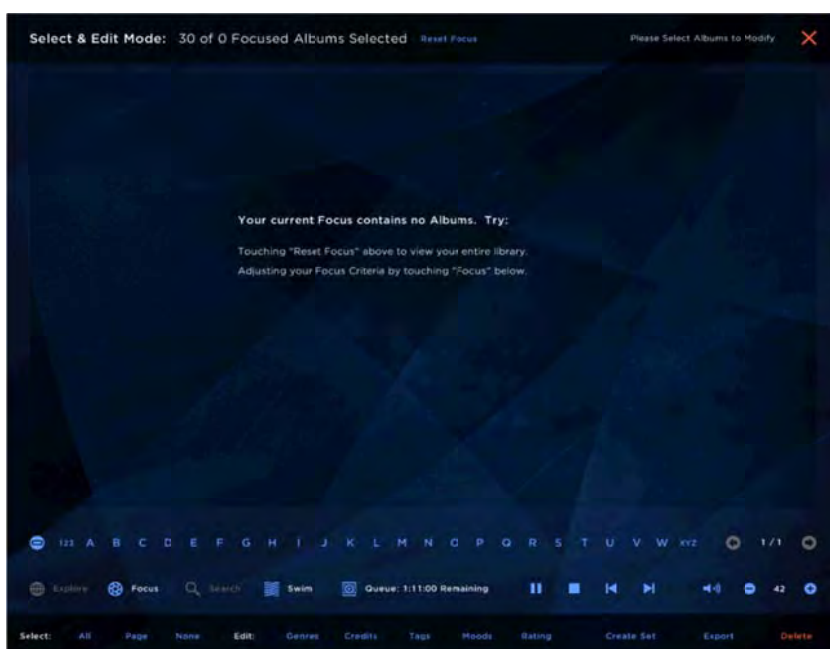
Here we have picked 'Barber, Samuel' and selected his role as Composer.

Press **Save Changes** and we step back to the **Select Credits to Add/Remove** screen shown below.



We can now pick the Credit to remove and the screen looks like this after we have chosen 'Samuel Barber' and Composer.

If we now press **Save Changes** (up to this point no changes have been made) the edit will be completed for all the selected albums.



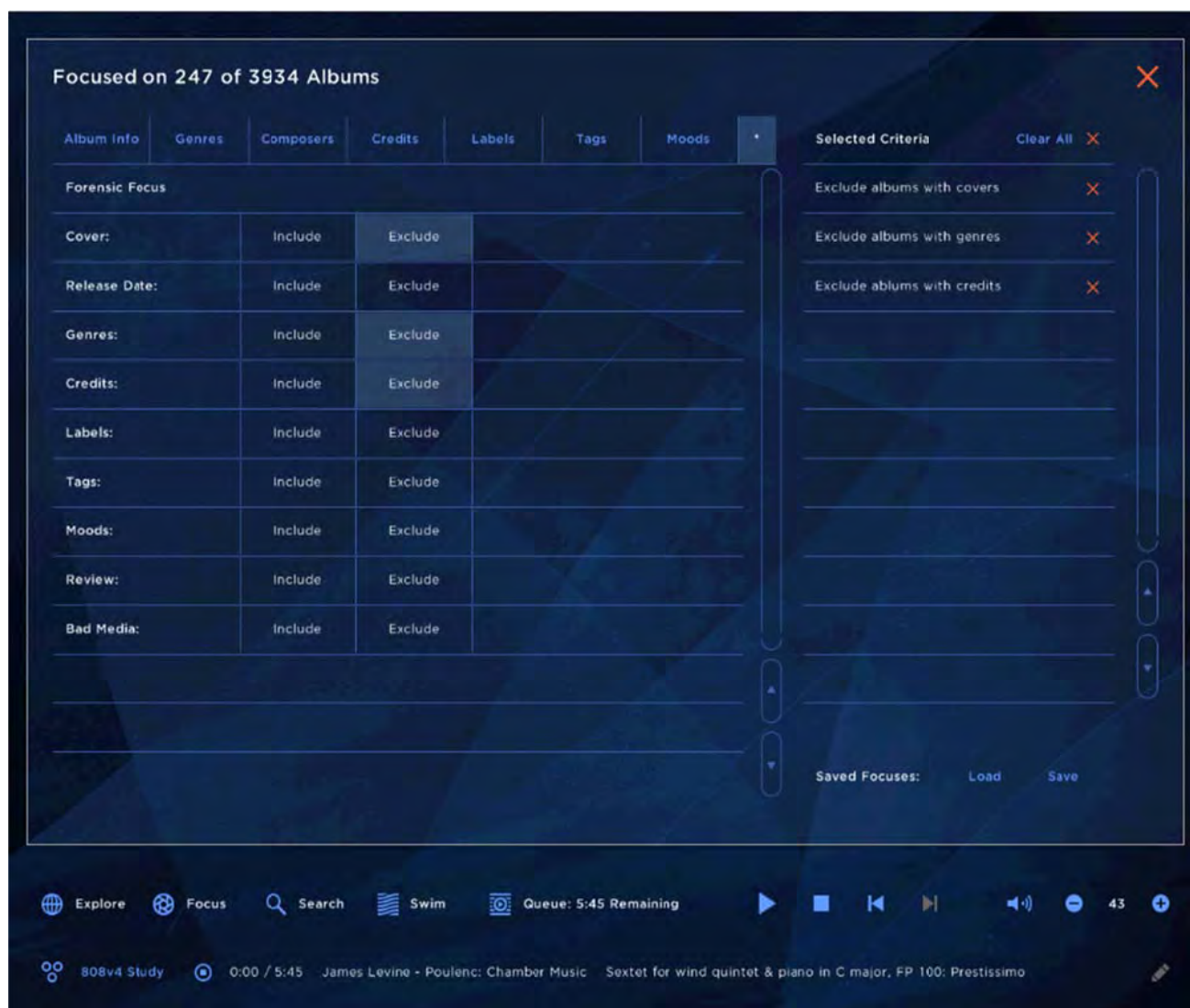
Notice that when this edit has been made, the current Focus no longer contains 'Samuel Barber' and so we end up with a blank screen.

You can confirm the edit by next making a Focus on 'Barber, Samuel'.

Bulk editing can also be used simply to add or remove Credits individually.

Forensic Focus

Generally when a large or specialised collection is imported into Sooloos there will be a percentage of Albums for which the metadata is not complete. The Forensic Focus allows us to immediately identify albums with/without certain data types. If the collection is to be optimised or groomed then this feature enables a systematic workflow.



The screen above shows the Forensic Focus dialogue (which is accessed by pressing the right-most Focus Tab marked *). We can use this to isolate those albums in the library with or without metadata types, such as cover art, release date, genres, credits, labels, tags, moods, review and also to identify media which the background checking processes feels is suspicious (and may therefore need re-importing).

In the example above we can see that there are 247 albums with no cover, genre or credit information. With this Focus we can now Tag the albums in **Select and Edit Mode** and start working.

Some Finer Points of Focus

Focus is a very powerful function and this section delves deeper to help you get the most out of it. As we described on page 16 the Focus screen has eight major sections (tabs): Album info, Genres, Composers, Credits, Labels, Tags, Moods and * (Forensics).

Album Info

The Album Info tab groups four different types of information:

- Most Played (which looks at play count – a dynamic counter based on use).⁸
- Date-related: Last played, Added and Release Date.
- Quality.
- Ratings, Picks and Skips.

Focus Logic

If we focus on any single criterion then the operation is fairly self-evident. For example, we can make a single focus on albums:

- recorded in 'High Resolution' or 'Content added in the last 3 Months' (Album Detail)
- containing music of the Romantic Era (Genre/Genre)
- featuring an instrument, e.g. 'Viola' (Genre/Instrumentation)
- containing a particular Form, e.g. 'Sonata' (Genre/Form)
- with works composed by Beethoven (Composer)
- featuring a particular artist, conductor, accompanist, e.g. Bryn Terfel, Claudio Abbado, etc (Credits)
- released by, e.g. ECM (Label)
- with a specific user tag.

Every criterion may also be negated, so the above examples could be 'exclude' rather than include. Useful for isolating hard-to identify groups, such as 'remind me what I have hadn't played in a year'.

Include/Exclude Must/May have

So, what happens when we focus on more than one criterion? The way it works depends on what they are, but the system can form extremely tight focuses, e.g. 'show me albums containing works composed by Dvorak, of form string quartet, that I haven't played for 3 months but ignore the ECM label'.

We have tried to make the focus operation intuitive but there are some subtleties worth grasping. Focus uses two logic operations in combining two or more criteria:

- Logical OR: if we combine two criteria in this way we mean we want to see any containing A or B. For example if we Focus on two composers (such as Bach and Copland) the number in the result will be greater than focussing on either individually. OR logic expands the answer. In simple terms we are looking for items that *may include A or B*.
- Logical AND: This logic is used to show items that must contain all criteria. So if we Focus on Bach and Cantata the resulting number will normally be smaller than taking either criterion individually. AND logic narrows the answer. In simple terms we are looking for items that *must include A and B*.

⁸ You may find that the number in focus is wrong. For example if you ask for the 100 most-played albums the number could be higher if some albums are included in sets.

The Sooloos system uses OR logic between same-type criteria but AND logic between different types. In this way picking a number of artists or genres will expand the focus, selecting a composer, genre and instrument will narrow it.

Genre

The whole topic of music genres keeps musicologists very busy. In Sooloos we have recently split the Genres focus into three separate sub-tabs and this was done to logically treat the three genre classes separately and to improve one's ability to narrow (focus in on) a selection.

The Genres tab has three sub tabs:

- Genres: This Genre/Style set allows us to roughly group music into types, e.g. jazz, country, classical, folk and so on.
 - Within each top-level Genre there are Subgenres and Styles and Focus allows you to select any level (all of a top-level, all of a sub-genre or just one style).⁹
 - In the Classical Genre we include all music which may be popularly referred to as 'Classical', however the Style lists include era and types.¹⁰
- Form: Here we allow you to specify musical forms.¹¹
- Instrumentation: This genre area allows us to flag or focus on ensembles or instrument types. For example we might just want to see oboe or guitar music or music for quartets.

Focus uses AND logic between these three sections and OR logic within each section. So adding more Forms will expand a focus, whereas looking for Forms with specific instrumentation will narrow the result. In Genres we can focus on queries such as: 'show me all romantic chamber music that includes bassoon'.

A list of the built-in Genre/Sub-genre/Style list is given in the appendix on page 62.

⁹ For example we could focus on just Jazz, or specify all Cool Jazz or even more granularly West Coast Jazz.

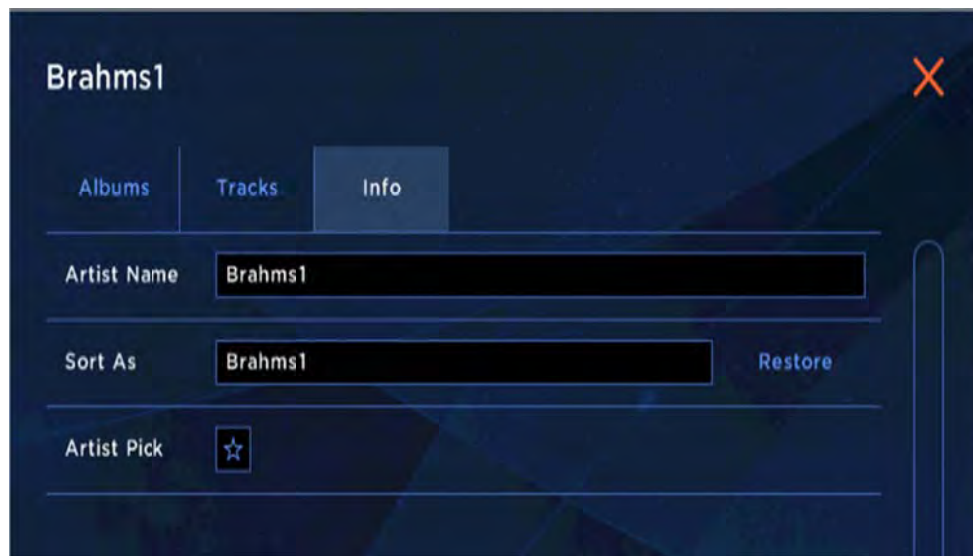
¹⁰ Era includes Medieval, Baroque, Renaissance, Classical. Romantic, Modern, 20th-century, etc.

¹¹ Classical Forms include such types as cantata, concerto, fugue, sonata, etc.

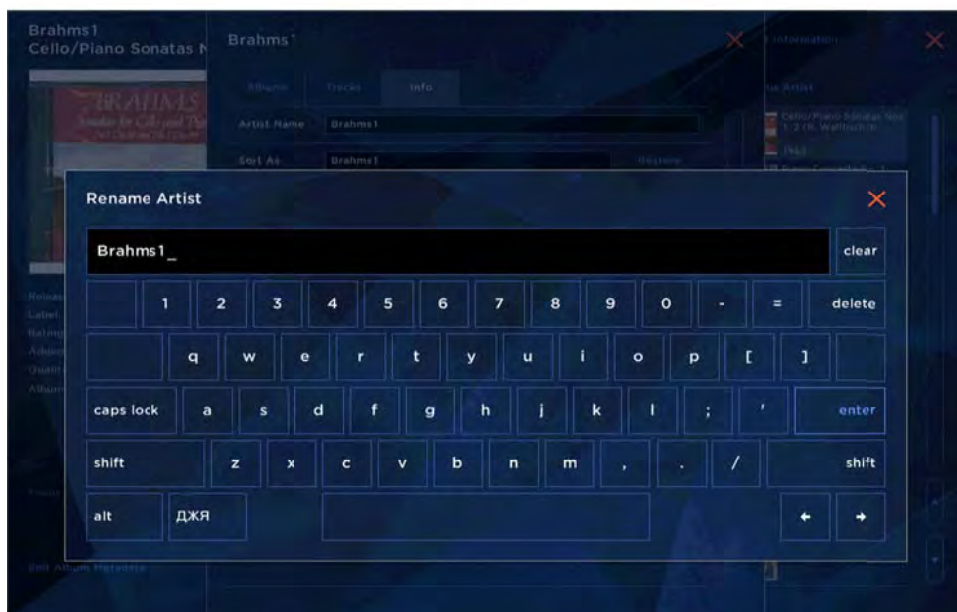
Renaming Album Artist



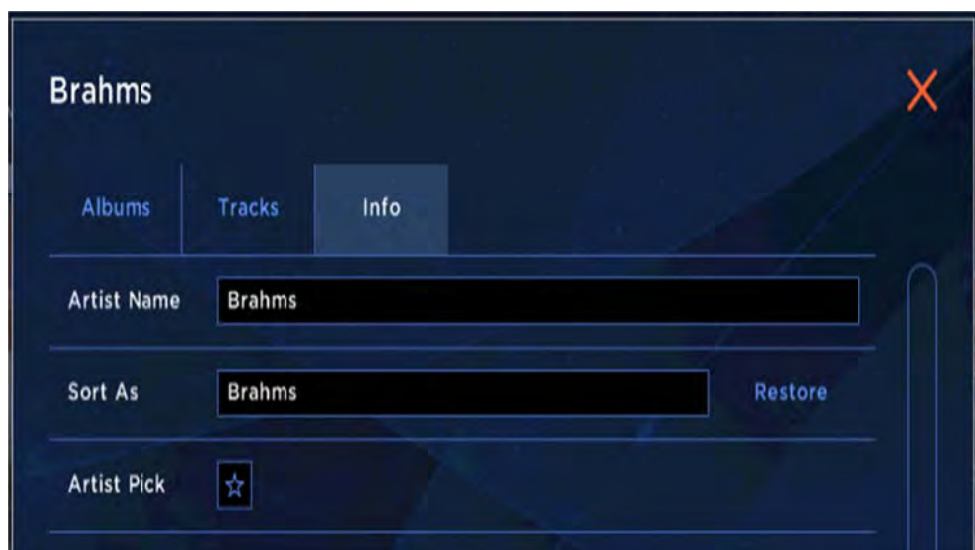
1. Touch an album by an Artist whose name you want to change.
In this example the first of Brahms1 is selected.
2. At top right of screen press: **Artist Information**. We get the screen below:



3. Touch the top Artist Name text box; a keyboard comes up.



4. Press **'delete'** to remove the '1'
5. Press **Enter**
6. Close the Windows with top right **X** and back at the top level you will see all 'Brahms1' changed to 'Brahms'.



Warning Note: Do not use this feature to rename one of the special compilation artists: 'Various Artists' or 'Soundtrack'. If an album has been incorrectly catalogued as 'Various Artists' then it should be dealt with specifically by editing the Album.

Caution Note: The example given here, where a composer was used in the Album Artist field is somewhat eccentric and we don't generally recommend doing this. There are some exceptions, e.g. if the composer is also a performer or conductor.

Appendix 1: The Elements of Metadata

Useful sources of Metadata

Here are some very useful websites for researching covers, performers, composers and music and disc issues.

www.allmusic.com has good depth of information on all genres of music. However its cover art tends to be limited to 250px and so some users will want to improve on this.

<http://www.discogs.com> has a good search engine and provides detailed discographies.

<http://www.arkivmusic.com/classical/main.jsp> has deep information on releases and you can browse by composer, conductor, performer, ensembles, labels and genre.

<http://www.amazon.com> (not just the USA site) is very useful for tracking down discs, release information and cover artwork. (Note, on Amazon, release date information can be unreliable).

www.google.com may lead you to a recording and the image search is invaluable for cover art.

<http://www.tineye.com/> This reverse image search (and its neat browser plug-in) is superb for determining if an image you have discovered can be bettered on the internet. The Sooloos system improves its performance for artwork up to 1000px.

<http://en.wikipedia.org/> Wikipedia has an astonishing amount of biographical, historical, musicological and occasionally discographical information.

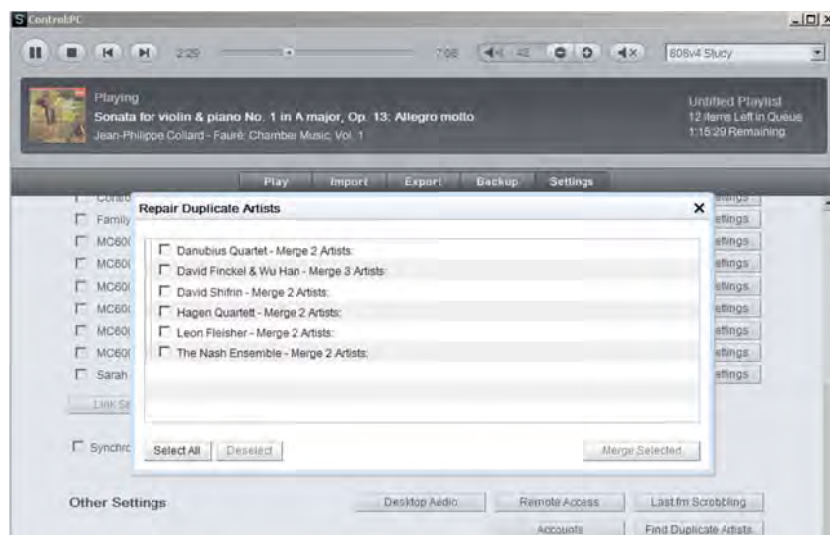
Duplicate Album Artists

If a collection is built up over time and especially if it combines collections or CD rips with file imports then it is possible that some artists may appear to have multiple identities. Symptoms would include artists showing up twice in the Explorer or not seeing all albums by the artists listed in an Album View.



Duplicate Artists can be resolved using Control:PC.

At the bottom of the Settings window look for **Find Duplicate Artists** button.



If artists are duplicated we get a dialogue box like this and options to merge duplicated artists into single unique identities.

Appendix 2: Managing a Collection



When building a collection it is useful to be able to keep an eye on the systems operating statistics.

On the left we see the Information screen which can be accessed from the Touchscreen Home menu.

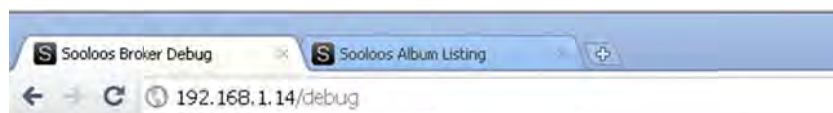
We can see the number of Artists, Albums and Tracks.

Also listed is the total storage seen by the server, how much is free, the software version number and the server (broker) IP address. (This is the address used by the mobile controllers iPad, iPhone etc).

You can also change the system's registration details.



If you do not have a Touchscreen the server's IP address can be found on the Settings tab in Control:PC.

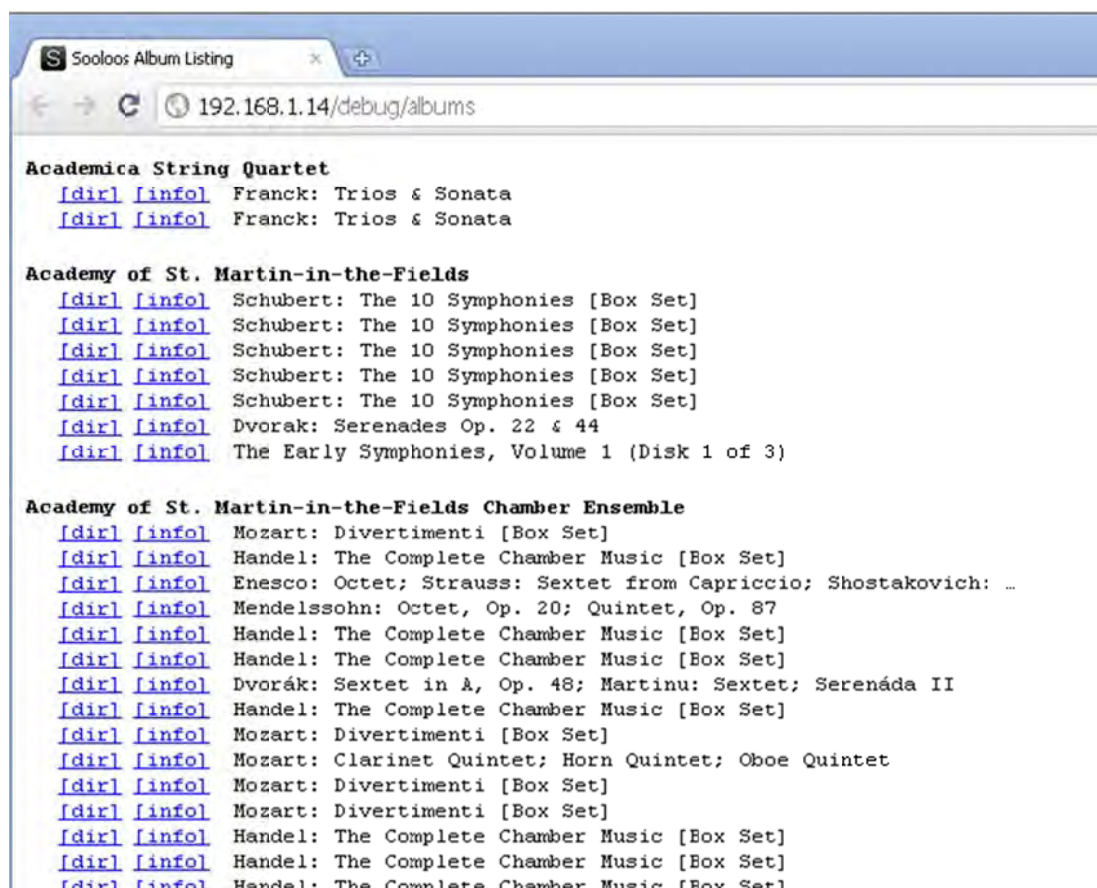
More detailed (maybe too much) information can be found by pointing a web browser to the debug information at <broker IP address>/debug.

In the example on the left we used the address: 192.168.1.14/debug.

This first screen shows artist, album and track counts.

If we click on Album Listing HTML then we can see a list of all the albums in the collection by artist.

It is handy to be able to print this out (see below).



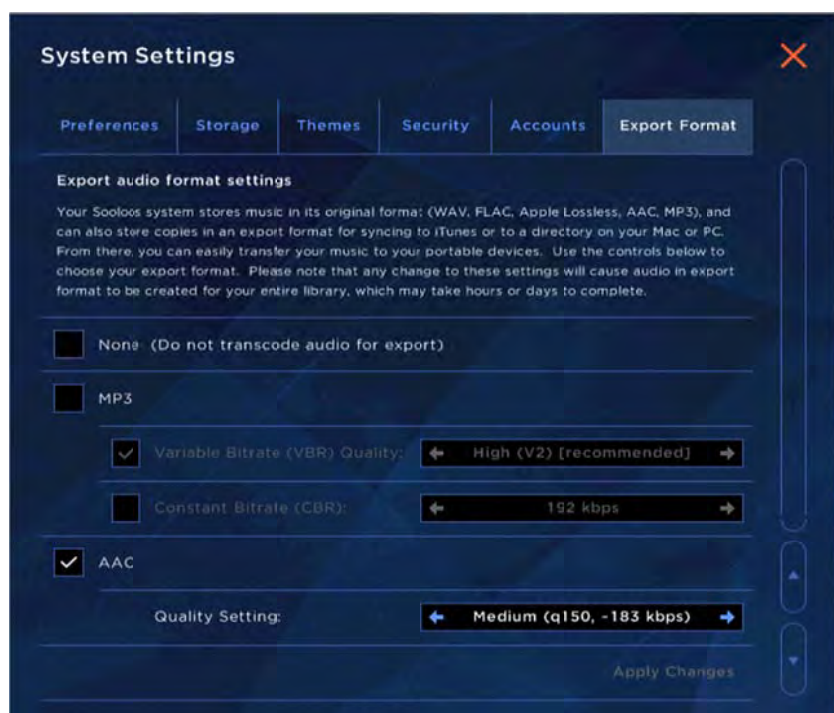
Appendix 3: Storage

Sooloos systems currently provide a number of options for storage.

- MC200 and Control:15 provide approximately 500GB and have single drives built in.
- MC600 and Twinstore have dual 1TB or 2TB drives and these are normally configured as RAID 1, which means that each drive is a mirror copy of the other. Mirrored drives are helpful because at some point drives inevitably fail, it is often possible just to swap out the faulty drive whereupon the system will restore the mirror.
- Content will be shared across all the drives in the system.

The default format in which Sooloos stores the audio is FLAC which is a lossless codec that provides around 40% reduction in space usage (depending on sample rate, bit depth and genre) with zero loss of quality.

The system can also handle Apple Lossless, WAV and AIFF lossless formats. The lossless files will be exported in their native format and so it is sensible to plan ahead on future requirements for the content.



You can set up the system to automatically transcode an additional lossy format of all the music which can then be exported to a drive for use with other media players or iTunes.

Plan ahead here because the system will take some time to perform a transcode (typical conversions may be 10,000 – 20,000 songs in 24 hours).

How much Storage?

The following table gives a guideline to sensible planning levels.

It is important not to allow the drives to become too full. The system needs space to keep log files, for housekeeping, transcoding and for storing playlists and saved focuses. We suggest that you consider adding storage if the system gets over 80% use.¹²

Backup

It is essential to maintain a good backup and it is the user's responsibility to maintain its integrity. A valuable collection, with many hours invested in grooming deserves more than one backup and for at least one to be kept offsite.

Sooloos provides Backup and Restore functions in Control:PC. You can backup to computer drives, portable USB or NAS drives.

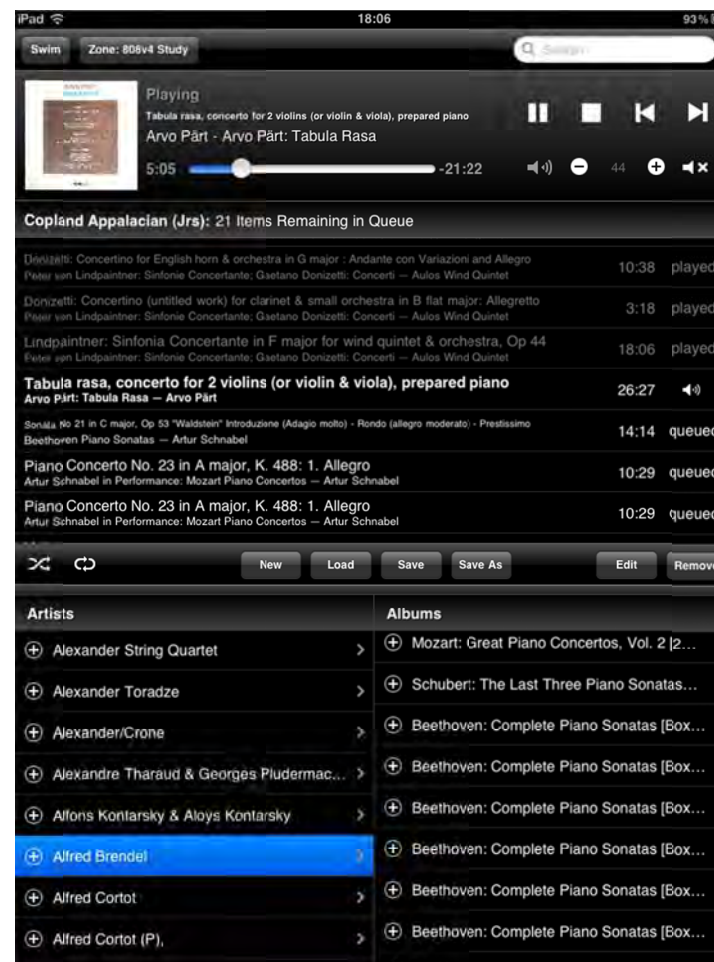
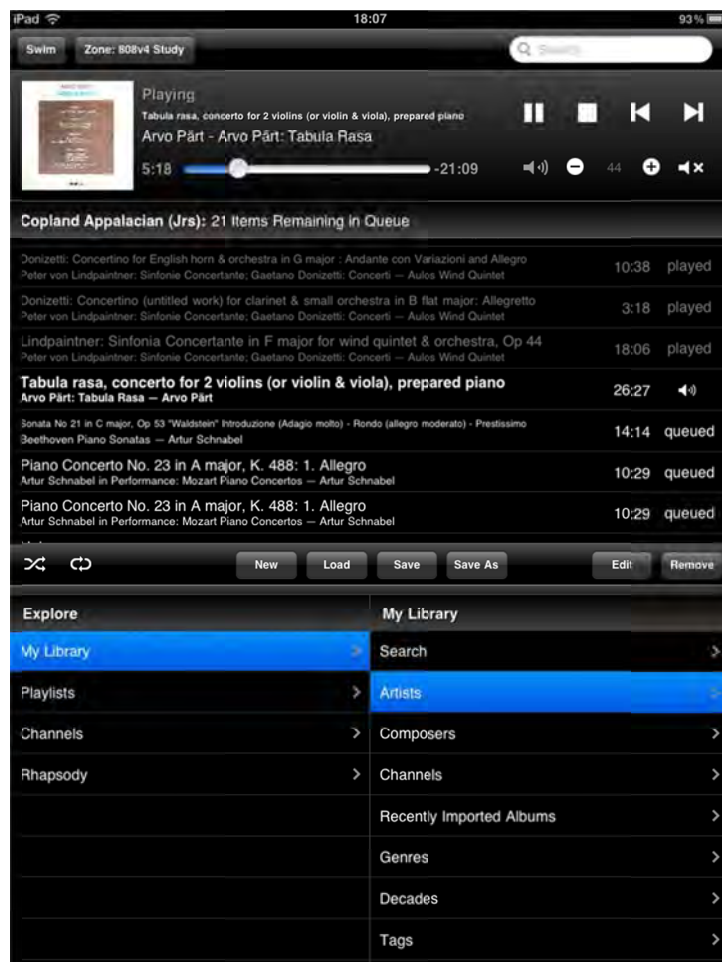
Appendix 4: Using the iPhone, Touch and iPad Controls

The Sooloos system can be controlled using the main Touch client, e.g. Control 15. However it can also be controlled using Control:PC/MAC and one if the three portable controllers.

This section illustrates by example how the portable control clients can be used to access and control library content. This section is particularly helpful if you are thinking through the finer points of preparing or grooming a collection in anticipation of using one of these devices.

¹² The Sooloos system incorporates remote monitoring and diagnosis. For this to work, it is necessary that the system be able to see the internet and that it is registered with us. If you skip registration then we have no means of contacting you if we see something going wrong!

Periodically the system will report to us the state of the hard drives and it is often possible to avert a disaster.

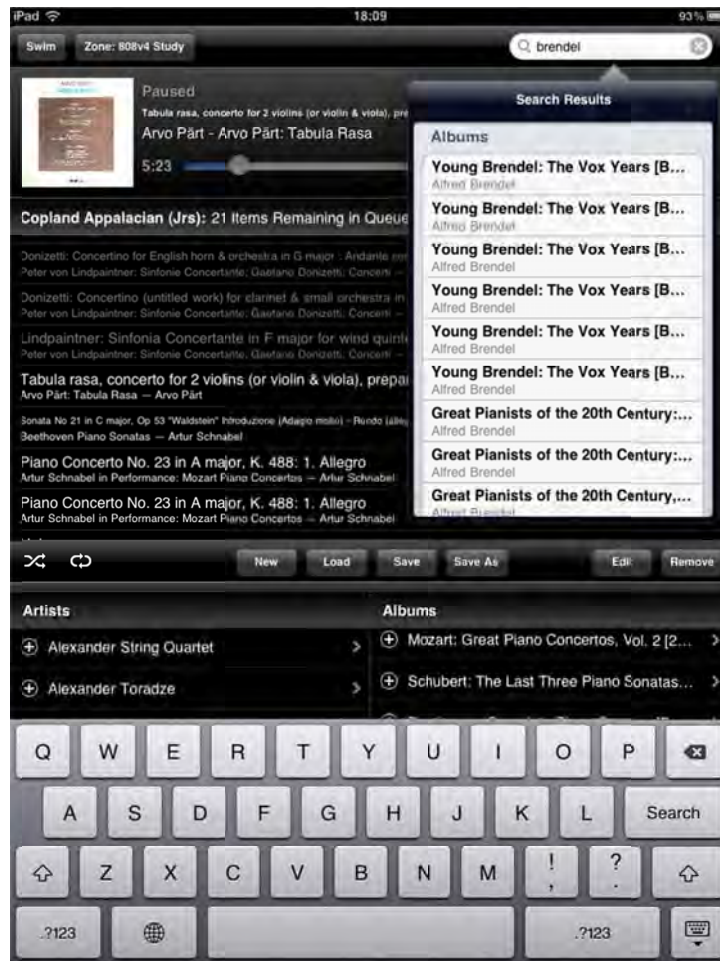


The iPad application has four main areas, from top to bottom:

- Search and Zone selection
- Now Playing, Volume and Transport controls
- Playlist/Queue. The Edit button allows us to remove or change the order of songs in the list. Playlists can be created or loaded, including those saved previously on the Control.
- Exploration area.

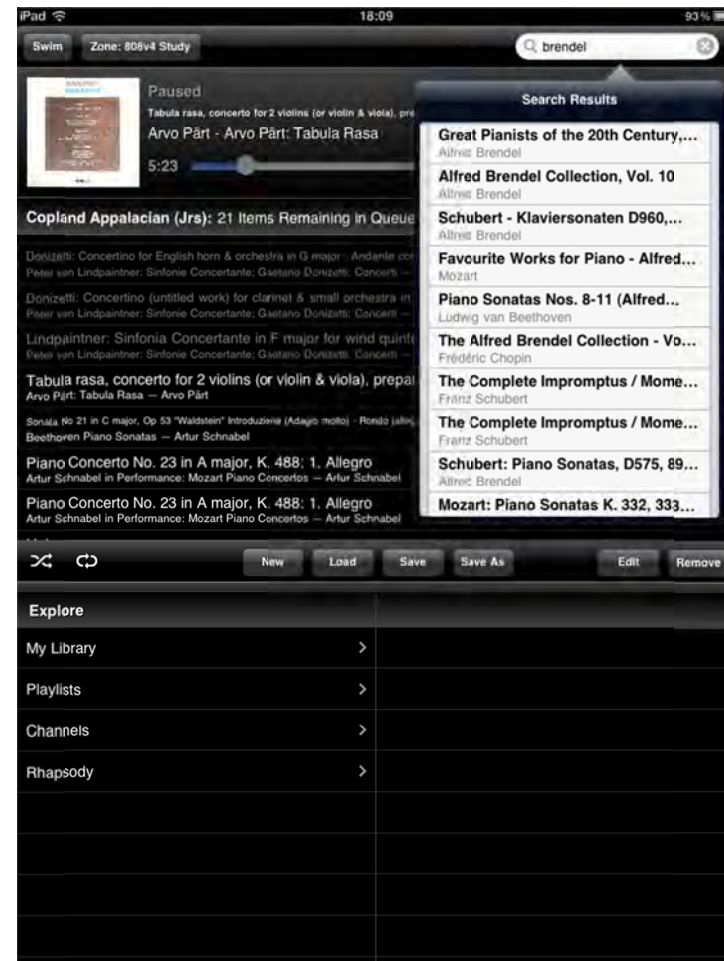
To Explore content the bottom section scrolls left <-> right.

In the screen above we have explored through Artist, A-B to *Alfred Brendel*. The right-hand list of Albums scrolls vertically.

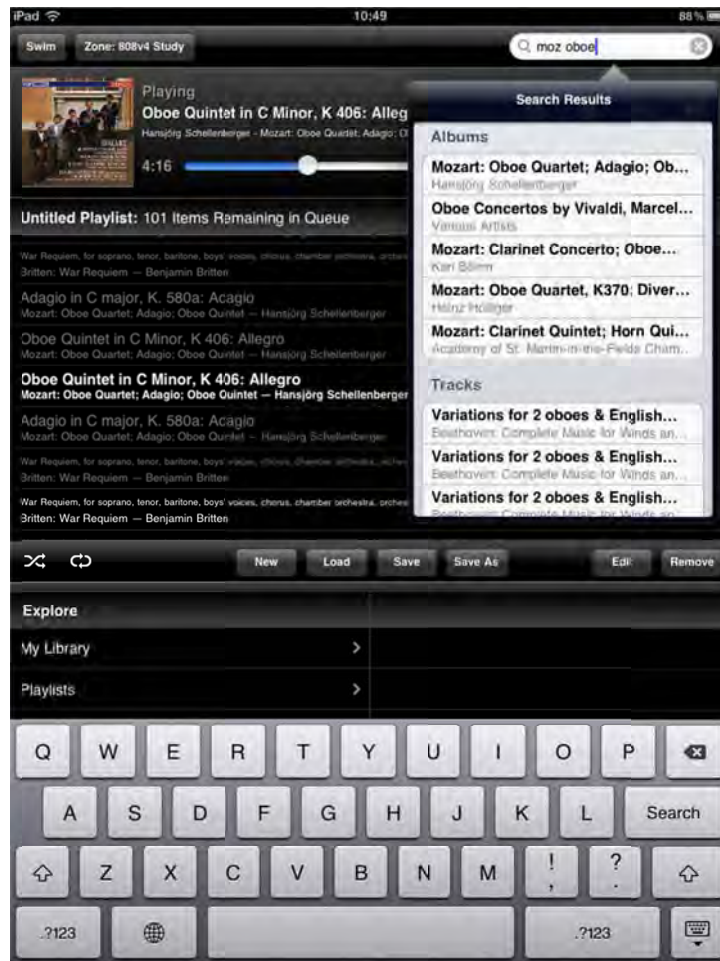


Search can be a convenient alternative to finding albums or works.

On the iPad, search results will include Albums and Tracks.



The search result is a list which can be scrolled vertically as shown above.



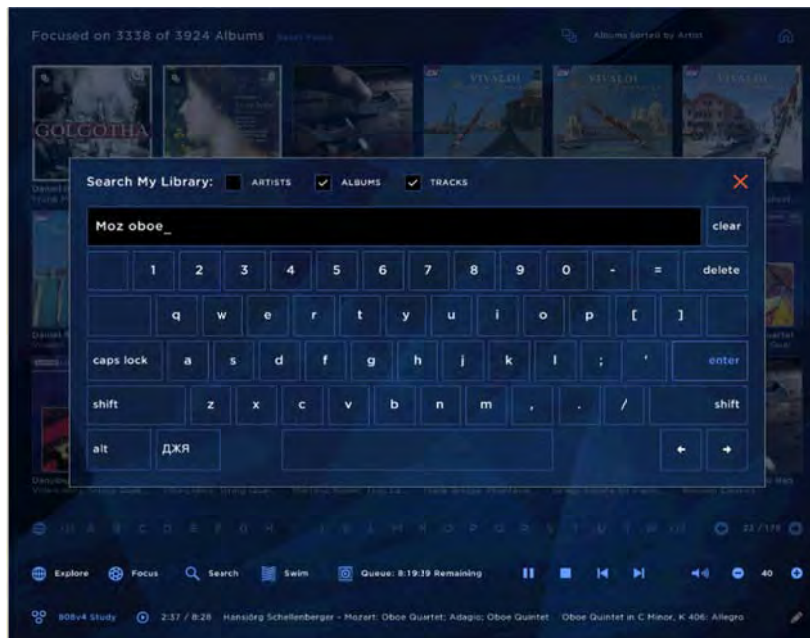
Searches do not have to be typed in full or use contiguous characters. This feature can be important in finding items with long names or where there might be too many results from a simple string search.

The example above uses 'moz oboe' on the iPad client.

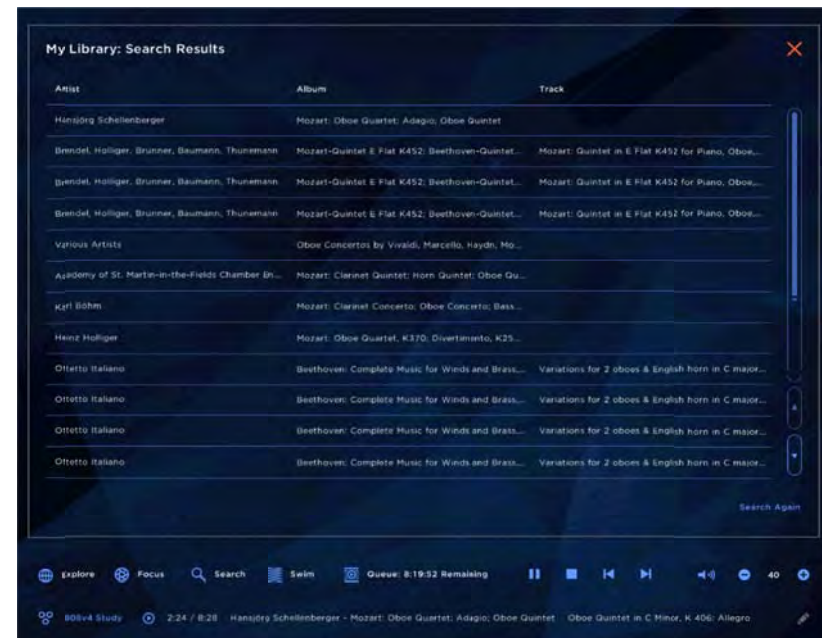


Here we see the same Quick Search query on the Touch/iPhone client.

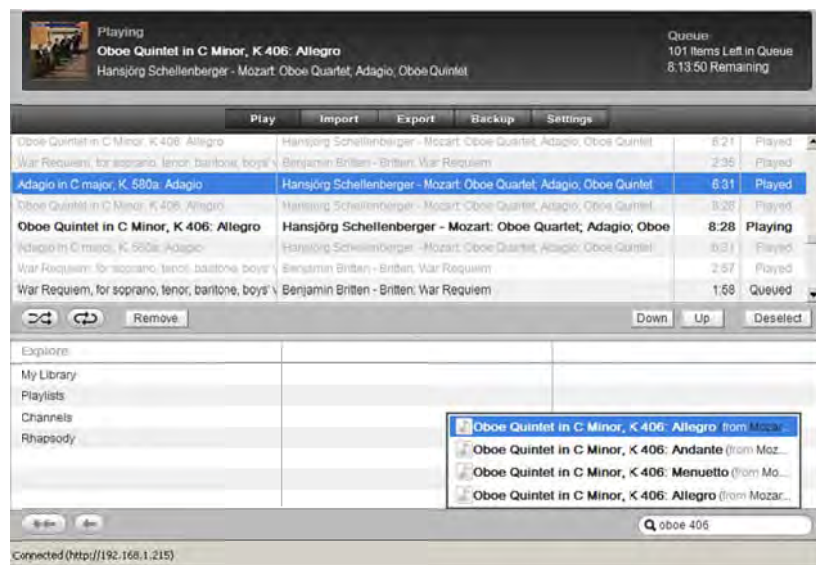
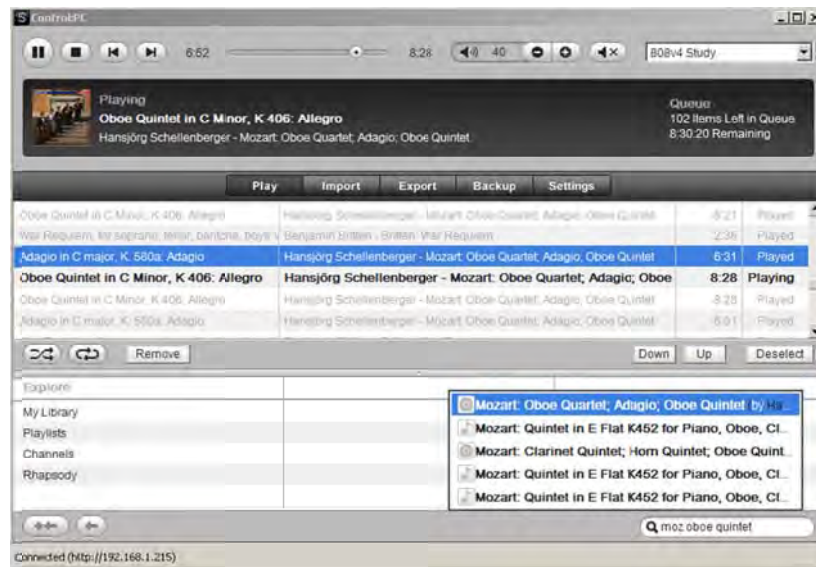
In both the iPad and iPhone applications we can see that albums and tracks are listed separately.



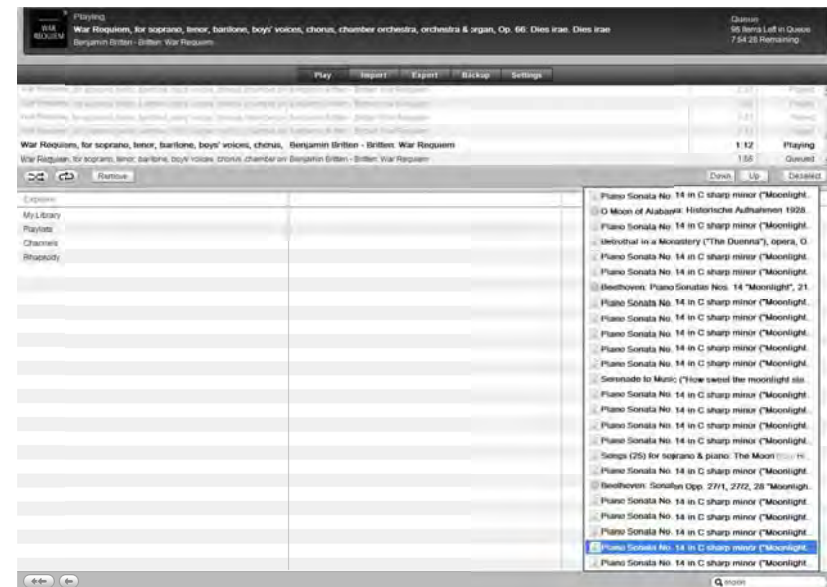
The same query can be performed on the main touch Control (note we picked Album and Tracks only) and we get the result shown opposite.



On the Control search can be customised to include combinations of Artist, Album or Track. We can touch any of the results to start playing or view more details.



Opposite we see two searches in Control:PC using different partial string targets. With care, experience and knowledge of the collection one can quickly develop a skill in searching.

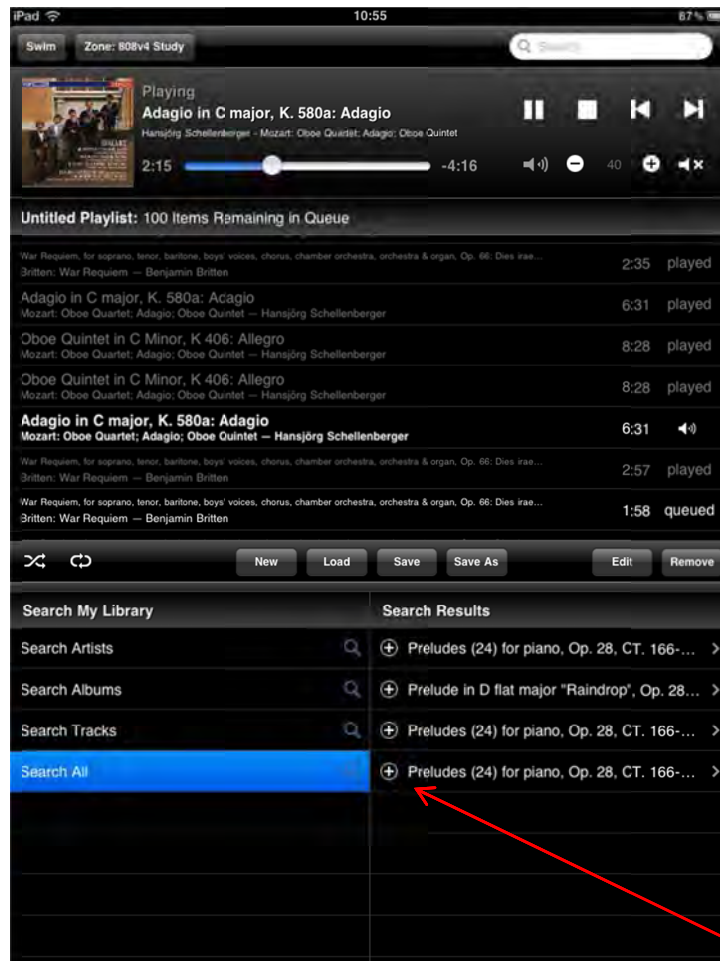


Control:PC/MAC is useful for editing album information and managing certain system settings. The number of items it can show from a search depend on how we adjust the Window as the example above illustrates.

Control:PC/MAC currently shows album and track results mixed in together and so it may be important to consider or refine the search terms if there are too many results. Search here (or in the iPhone/iPad) does not enforce contiguous string matches so you can enter a term containing parts of the target, so e.g. entering :

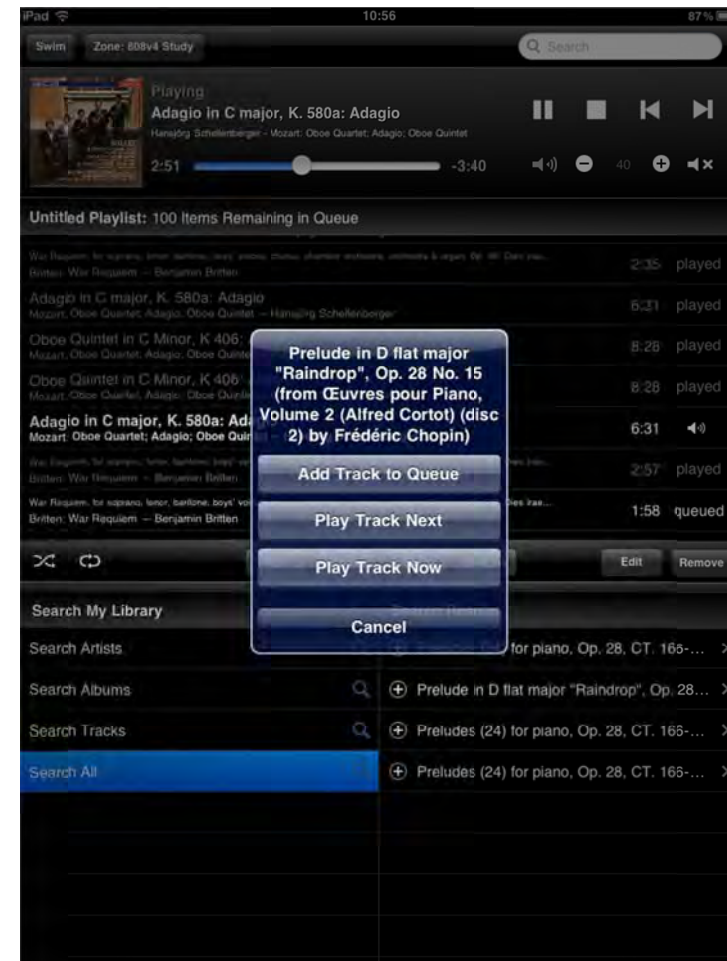

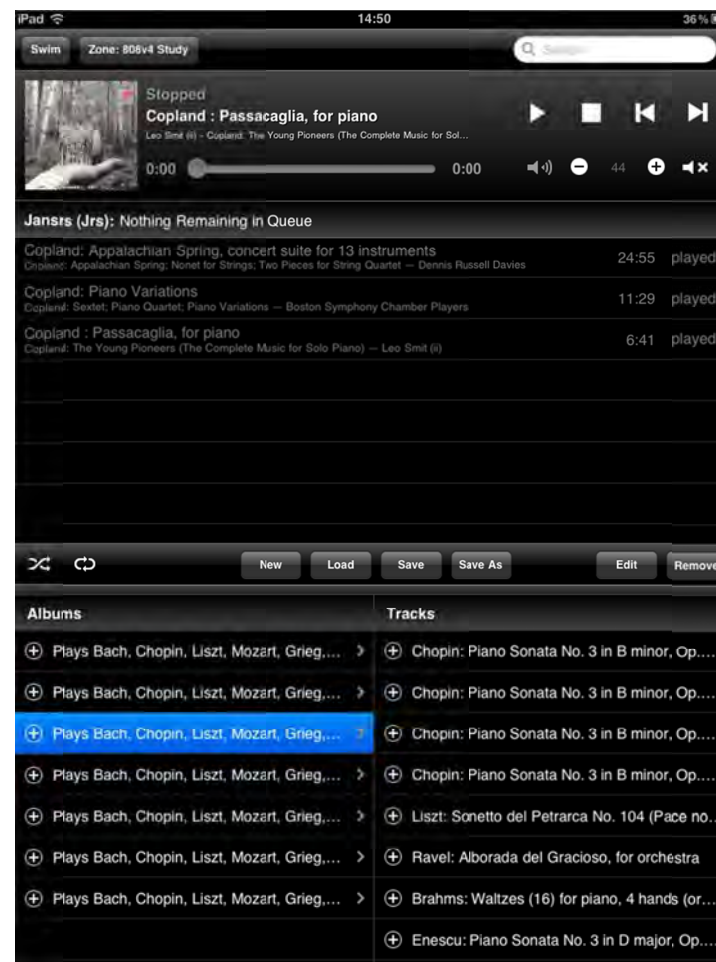
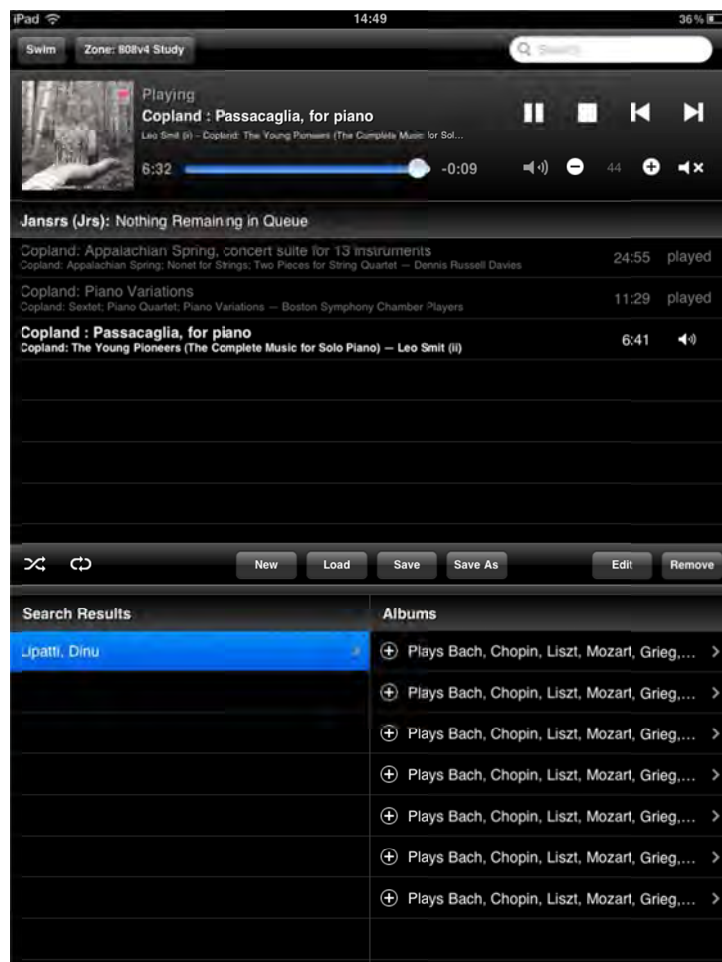


Search can provide useful results from simple terms.

To see more about the results or take actions, we can touch the + symbols which produce a listing dialog.



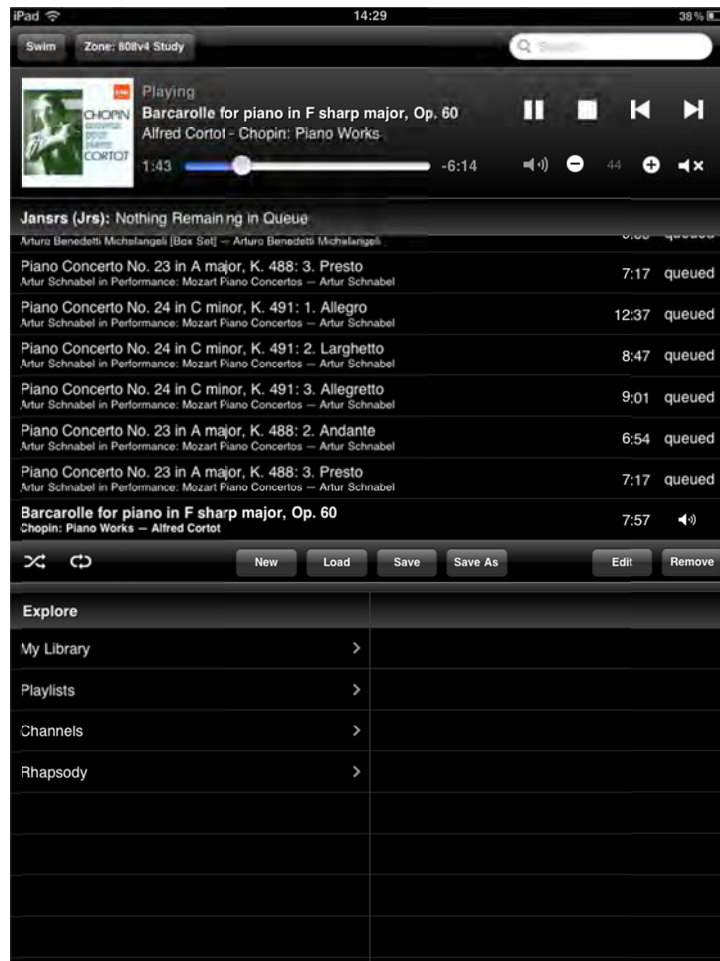

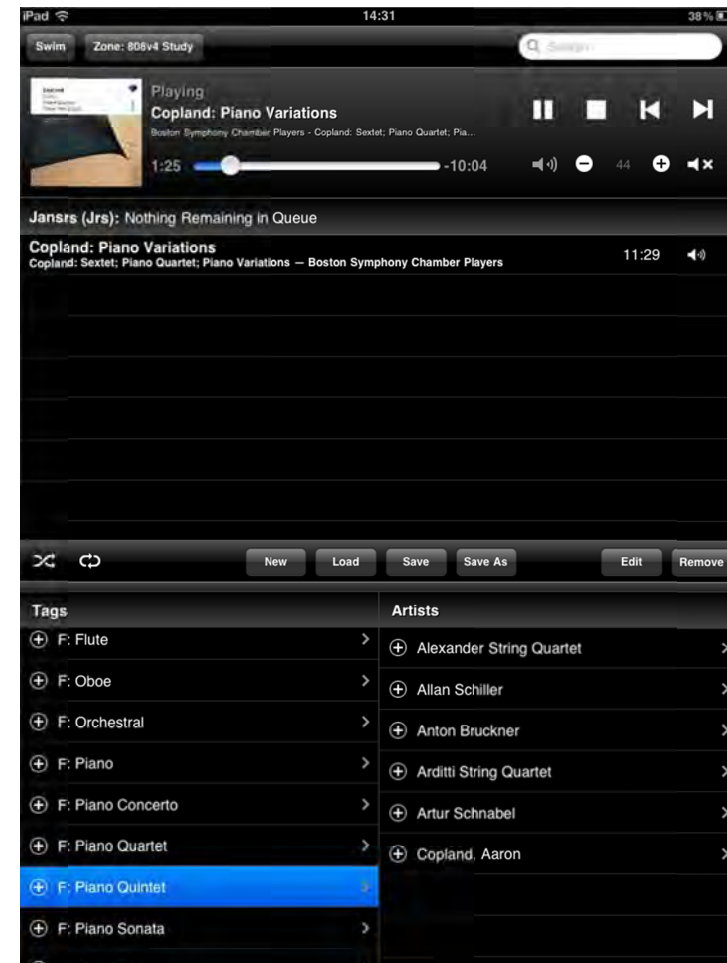

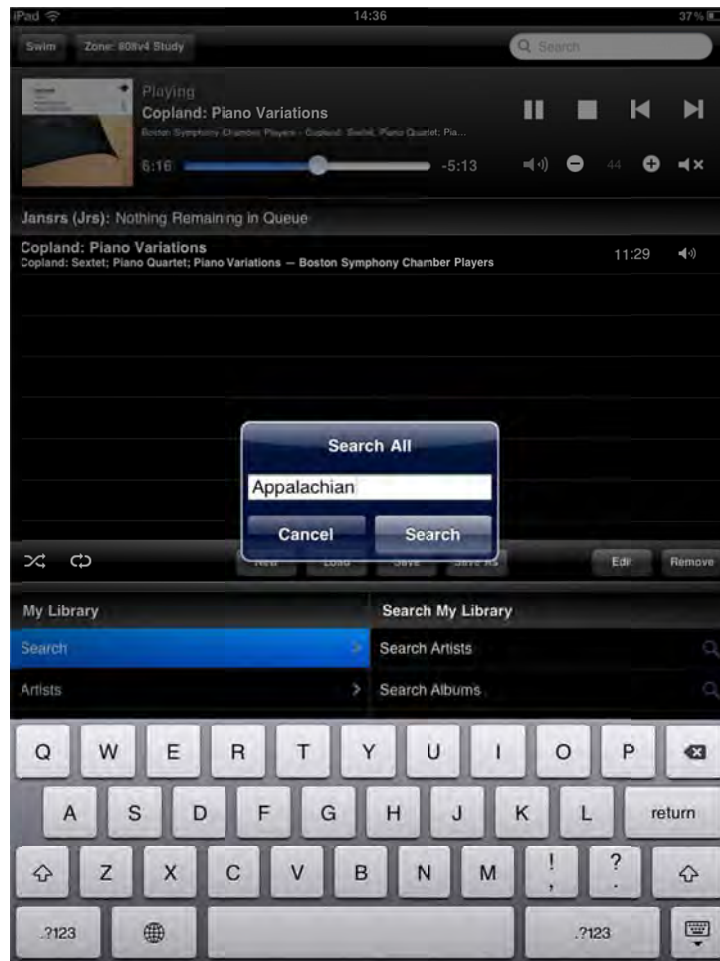

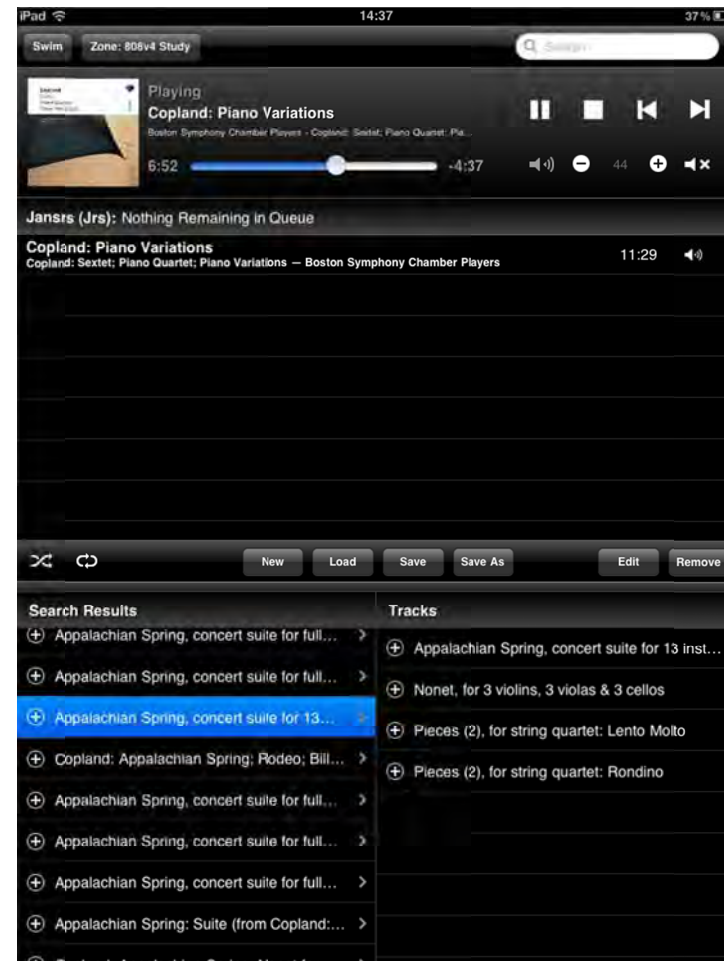


More sophisticated exploration of the content can show **Genres** (including Form or Instrumentation) or **Tags** which are free descriptors added on the Control.

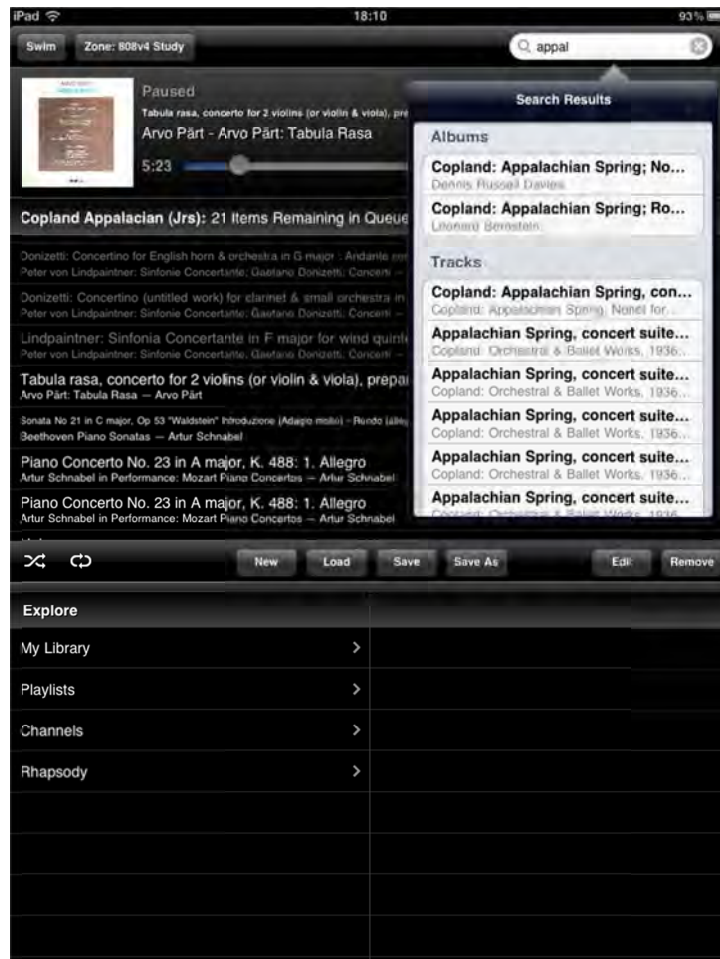

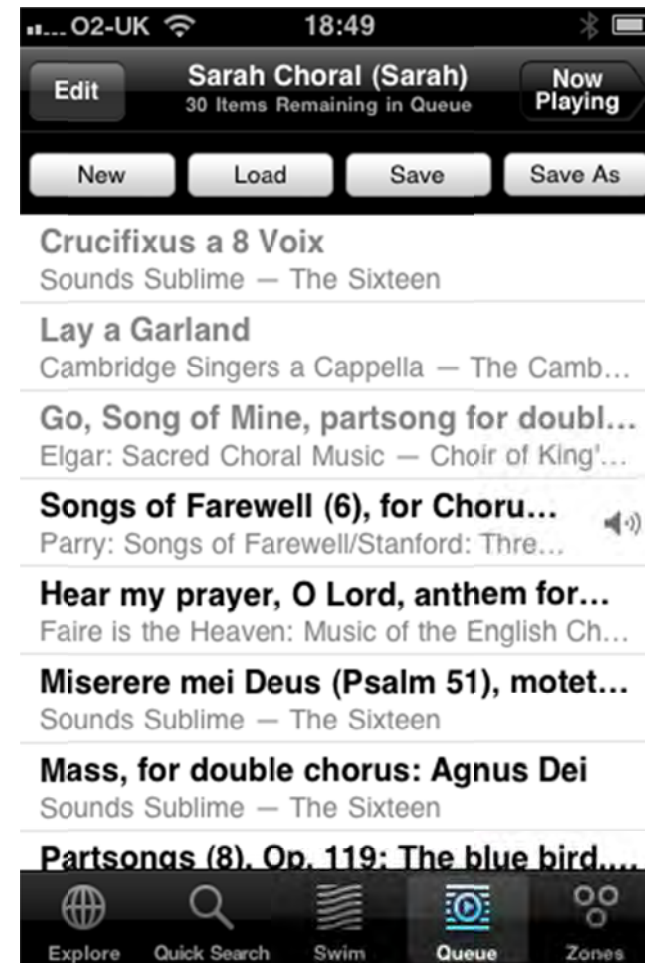
We can also perform free-form library searches. In this example we are looking for performances of *Appalachian Spring*.
